Circle of Caring Congregational Care Ministry Team

There is a lot of excitement and enthusiasm in the halls of UBC as we begin the new church year. Among the new programs being introduced is the latest Circle of Caring Team, Congregational Care Ministry. The purpose of this team is to stay in touch with our members by phone, email or visit as requested. The team will also follow up with visitors, contact those who have been frequently absent on Sunday mornings, and help with orientation of new members.

Organization of the Congregational Care Ministry began last fall at the Circle of Caring luncheons. Members were asked to complete a survey indicating whether having a church member stay in touch was important to them. Everyone who responded that it is “important” or “very important” has been assigned to a team member.

Let me introduce the team. Those staying in touch with families are **Shirley Clark, Judy Gough, Jackie Lockwood, Donna Marshall, Judy Shah, Mildred Spicer, Lynda Tweel, and Nelda Vaughan**. Each has been assigned approximately ten families. **Richard Smith** will see that visitors receive appropriate contact, **Jo-Ann Averill** will contact those we miss in worship, and **Erin Brown** will be the contact for new members. Both visitors and missing regular worship attenders will be identified from the attendance sheets (the little red books you are asked to sign each Sunday).

This fall you will **not** receive a card from “your Deacon” but rather a card from your Congregational Care team member. Unlike Deacons, the Congregational Care Team will not rotate on a regular basis. Once assigned, you will likely have the same contact person for several years, allowing the relationship and trust to build over time. If you are not happy with your assigned team member for any reason, please contact the church office, and you will be reassigned.

It’s never too late to sign up. If you want to have a team member assigned to you, either call the church office or contact Debra Bryant at (434) 295-6754, or email: Debra.L.Bryant@gmail.com. If you thought you were signed up, but have not been contacted by the end of September, please also call the church office. Sue Walton will have a list of current family assignments.

In preparation for the kick-off of this team, Jack Averill provided training for the team members. Even long time Deacons found the session very helpful. Jack emphasized listening, discretion, and confidentiality – good lessons to learn. On-going training will be provided for team members as needed. If you are interested in serving on the Congregational Care Ministry Team, we would love to have you. Again – it’s never too late, and we could use at least two more volunteers. Helping everyone stay connected and know they are important and cared for – what a beautiful gift you can offer.

St. John's Bible

On Wednesday, September 17, at 6:15 pm, in Fellowship Hall, Tracy Hartman, professor at Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond, will be displaying and talking about sections from The Saint John's Bible.

The Saint John's Bible is the first handwritten and illuminated Bible to be produced in over 500 years. The painstakingly crafted, seven-volume project, that involved a dozen artists from around the world in dedicated work for more than a decade, is a rare masterpiece of art and inspiration. Smithsonian Magazine called this project "one of the most extraordinary undertakings of our time."

Welcome, Ambassador Nat Howell



W. Nathaniel Howell, former United States Ambassador to Kuwait (1987-1991), will speak on "Persecution of Christians in Iraq" this coming Wednesday, September 10, at 6:15 p.m., in Fellowship Hall.

Howell wants to raise the awareness of this dire situation in our churches, mosques, synagogues and other faith institutions, in hopes that we will unite to provide

support and assistance to these beleaguered co-religionists.

Ambassador Howell is the John Minor Maury, Jr. Professor of Public Affairs at the University of Virginia, where he is Director of the Institute for Global Policy Research and the Arabian Peninsula and Gulf Studies Program. He joined the General Faculty upon retirement from the Foreign Service of the United States in December 1992. He had served in the U.S. Foreign Service since 1965.

Nat served as Ambassador to the State of Kuwait from August 1987 until December 1990, four months after the Iraqi invasion of that country. His book (with Roberta Culbertson) Siege: Crisis Leadership: The Survival of U.S. Embassy Kuwait is the true story of how the embassy and the American community were held together under the leadership of Ambassador Howell when Iraqi soldiers invaded Kuwait and surrounded the U.S. Embassy.

Dr. Howell received his B.A. degree with Honors from UVA and a Ph.D. in Government and Foreign Affairs from the same institution. He studied the Arabic language at the Foreign Service Institute in Beirut, Lebanon.

Nat is married to Margie Anne Saunders, and they have one surviving son, Wilson Nathaniel III.
