During our harvest luncheon on Sunday, Jeff Cranford led us in a discussion of possible new ministries that UBC can engage in for the next two years.

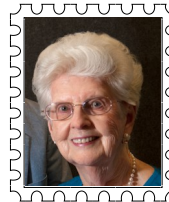


pact with UVA students. For each category, participants came up with many specific and creative ideas, though we affirmed that research should undergird our work and that new undertakings need not be big ones.
