A Word From Michael

In my sermon this past Sunday, I told of a time from my childhood when I was shocked and a little disgusted at finding a bag of overripe, bruised peaches in our kitchen. Yet later that night, when we had some of those peaches for dessert, they were the juiciest, sweetest peaches I've ever had.

How many times do we reject God's gifts just because, like those overripe peaches, those gifts are not presented to us in ways that are perfectly wrapped to our liking? Every day, we are confronted with people and situations that are different from what we expected or hoped for. In life, we have to reach beyond what is different and unfamiliar or initially uncomfortable to experience the rich fullness – even the sweetness – of what God offers.

Inside this newsletter, you'll see pictures from our intergenerational mission trip last week in DC. On Sunday, youth and adults who went on the trip offered an inspiring glimpse into their week, with their mornings filled with projects to help poverty-focused nonprofits. In the afternoons, the group led a VBS for about 100 underprivileged children. Throughout the week, these UBC members worked in very unfamiliar circumstances with very different people; yet by the end of the week, they found common ground and tremendous

blessing. Our mission team truly offered an example of what it means to accept God's blessings, even when those blessings are disguised in challenge, hard work, and discomfort.

The intern at City Gate wrote to Erin Brown: *"I just wanted to thank you again for an amazing week. I am just so thankful for you and your group. I'm sure I'm not supposed to have had a favorite group, but yours was absolutely it! This summer was challenging (and wonderful) in many ways, and your group made last week the BEST week of the entire summer! I regularly told my family and roommates how grateful I was!"*

As part of their testimony on Sunday, Erin Brown thanked UBC for its support of the trip – financial support, logistical support, and prayer support. Similarly, inside this newsletter, you'll find a thank-you from missionary Paula Settle, explaining how our support has made a difference in the lives of young people breaking the cycle of poverty in Nada, Kentucky. Finally, during her ordination service on Sunday afternoon, Randi McFarland expressed her appreciation for the mission-mindedness of UBC. I share Randi's sense of thanksgiving to be part of such a congregation.




Mission Opportunity: WMU School Supplies Project

The WMU is collecting money to purchase school supplies for the low-income children at Woodbrook Elementary School. This project is coordinated by Love INC in cooperation with city and county schools' Family Support Workers.

You can make checks payable to UBC and mark them for "School Supplies."

- * This money helps purchase school supplies all during the year.
- * This money also helps with shoes, emergency clothing, hygiene needs, and healthy snacks for these same children during the school year.



Did You Know?

- * Parents spend \$50-\$100+ per child in elementary school on school supplies to start the year.
- * There is a steady increase in this area of families that need to share housing expenses with another family.
- * Market value rent for a two-bedroom apartment in one apartment complex in the Woodbrook district is \$1,249 to \$1,284 a month without utilities included.
- * At the end of the 2014-2015 school year, Woodbrook had 335 students enrolled with 48% of them receiving Free/Reduced Price lunch.

Thank you for your gifts. They do make a difference!!!!


