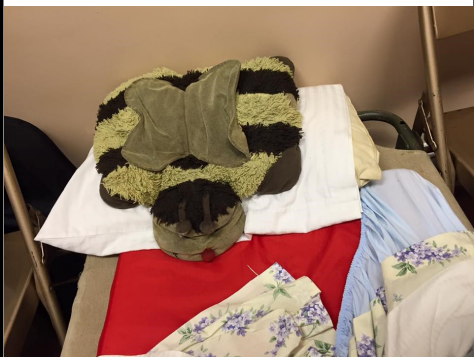

Leadership Transition Team Update

The LTT has met three times recently to begin determining how we can best answer the call that God and you, the church, have given us. We met on Sunday, January 31, to get to know one another, elect officers, and determine our process. We met again on Wednesday February 3, to review information from the MRST, the Associate Minister Search Committee, and the Personnel Committee. We then met on Monday, February 8, to consult with Travis Collins, who worked with the MRST and is an expert in church leadership transitions. Alba Beasley and Will Brown also attended this meeting, and they have been invited to future meetings as ex officio members.

We will meet again this week to evaluate the various options that are available for UBC during this time of transition. We are blessed to have a unique and diverse array of people on the team, with a wealth of experience from all walks and stages of life. Through the collective gifts and shared wisdom of the people at UBC, we believe we can accurately discern God's will and help move the church forward in a way that best serves our Christian mission.

We have set a target date of no later than March 6 to deliver a recommendation to church leadership about how UBC should approach and manage the transition, and we will present that recommendation to the congregation as soon as possible thereafter. While there is certainly a degree of urgency to our work, we are committed to proceeding in a prayerful, thoughtful, and purposeful way. We will communicate frequently with the congregation as we work toward helping the church continue to grow in the way God intends.

The members of the LTT feel excited and blessed to have this opportunity to serve the church. We welcome any input you have to offer; please feel free to speak with any member of the LTT to share your comments, questions, or concerns. We thank you for your prayers and support, and we appreciate all the encouragement that you have offered!

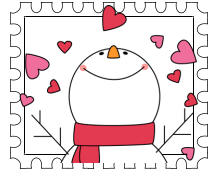
