Paula Settle has written:

My major project for this summer is to help one couple in Owsley County. He is about 73, can't read, has dug graves all of his life. His wife died 13 years ago, and he now has a 33-year-old mentally challenged lady living with him.

The house is falling down, so they are living in a one-room shed. They have no running water, no bathroom, and only one outlet that works. They have no refrigerator.

I have two churches that will be working to get them a bathroom, windows, sink, etc. I am going to pay a local electrician to redo the electrical work.

I don't think there is any way that these churches can pay for everything that needs to be done. It is unbelievable that people are still living like this. I would like to request that this year's offering go to help this one family.

Leadership Transition Team Update

Following the congregation’s approval on March 16 to call a part-time Interim Minister, the Leadership Transition Team, in conjunction with the Personnel Committee and with input from ministers and staff, has conducted a thorough search and has found an excellent minister that it would like to recommend to the congregation to help manage the transition period at UBC: **Rev. Gary Dalton**.

Rev. Dalton has recently completed a successful interim ministry at Grace Baptist Church in Richmond. He was the Senior Pastor for eight years at Belmont Baptist Church in Charlottesville. Gary holds a Master of Divinity from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, KY, and has completed interim ministry training offered by the Center for Congregational Health.

The LTT and the Personnel Committee feel that Rev. Dalton's education, experience, and background are a strong match for what our church needs right now in support of its worship, fellowship, and pastoral care ministries. Likewise, we feel that Rev. Dalton's expertise in the areas of church leadership and transition management will be invaluable for UBC as we all continue to discern the next stage that God has planned for our church. 
OIAM Signup Luncheon Sunday, April 17 After Worship

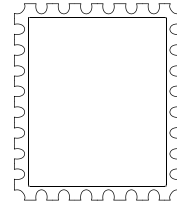
