Supporting God’s Work

Recently the local public radio station WVTB began its fall fund drive. They frequently interrupt programs to remind listeners that programming would “not be possible without the generous support of listeners like you.” Hearing the fund drive reminds of the way we support God’s work at University Baptist Church. Every ministry we have is because of the generous support of members like you.

I do not often think about this, but every dollar we give makes a difference in God’s work. Jesus said, “The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour until all of it was leavened” (Matthew 13:33). Yeast is very small. Years ago a minister and friend of mine named Joe Kutter wrote a column in his church newsletter. If we believe in what we say, sing, and pray each week, we can joyfully support it. If the church were not asking for money, it would be a dying church. If we do not tell people about opportunities to give, we deprive them of the chance to join God’s Kingdom work.

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 says, “The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.”

Very soon the Stewardship Committee will begin its work. As a congregation, we can get ahead of them. We can intertwine our faith journey with our financial support for God’s ministry. We can begin prayerfully considering what we will pledge next year. But before we do, we can look back at how we have supported the church this year. Are we giving what God has called us to give? Writing this column has led me to evaluate how I support God’s ministry at 1223 West Main St., Charlottesville. And I feel God leading me to increase my giving.

I believe in what we do. I want to see it grow. I want to share God’s grace and mercy with more people in our community. Together we can join what God is already doing in our community. We should be excited about supporting it!

Alma Hunt Offering For Virginia Missions

During October we are supporting the Alma Hunt Offering for Virginia Missions. Our Goal: \$3,000

This offering supports ministries in and missionaries from Virginia. A portion of the money goes back to the local associations. Since the CVBA (Central Virginia Baptist Association) supports the chaplain ministry, that means our contributions will be supporting the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women.

Venable Backpack Mission Project

The Venable Backpack Program provides a backpack of food each Friday to children at Venable School who receive free lunch at school during the week, but don’t have enough to eat at home over the weekends.

The kids in our Children’s Missions Program on Wednesday nights will be packing the bags to be delivered to the school each week.

You can help by donating food.

- ◆ **Easy meals:** mac-n-cheese, ramen noodles, Cup-o-Noodles, canned soup, canned chicken, Chef Boyardee, etc.
- ◆ **Fruit:** applesauce, individual servings of peaches/pears/mixed fruit, raisins
- ◆ **Milk:** shelf-stable milk in individual servings (like Horizon or Organic Valley)
- ◆ **Juice:** juice boxes, Caprisuns, or other juices in individual servings
- ◆ **Other foods:** individually-packaged breakfast items (cereal, protein bars, oatmeal, grits, etc) and individually-packaged snacks (packs of sandwich crackers, Goldfish, pretzels, popcorn, granola bars, etc.).



We also need brown paper grocery bags with handles to help package and deliver the food to the school.

Collection boxes are located in the First Floor Lobby and Fellowship Hall.
