## On Watch

'Tis the season... [fill in the blank]

With Thanksgiving behind us, we are entering into the season of Advent. This is the time when we prepare our hearts for Christmas and remember Jesus' birth. We do not do this because we know the details of the Christmas story. We celebrate Christmas each year because Jesus is the cornerstone of our faith. His birth marks God incarnate entering the world. We can then look to Jesus' life as a model for our lives. His death and resurrection (Lent, Holy Week, and Easter on our Christian calendar) fill in the rest of the story.

There are concurrent celebrations around this time of year. Hanukkah, Kwanza, Chinese New Year, and more are all happen-

ing. There is the secularization of Christmas (Santa, Frosty, etc.). Offices have Christmas (aka Holiday) parties. Friends gather for Christmas soirees or holiday hoedowns. Families travel to see loved ones. Students (and teachers!) get a break from school. With all this celebration, it is easy to get swept up in it all.

Recently I heard a news story about how to avoid overspending during the holiday season. As I listened, I pictured the poor, teenaged, single, and pregnant girl, Mary. Over the centuries, the church venerates her. Hardly a Dutch or Renaissance master missed the opportunity to paint Mary-the-Mother-of-Our-Lord. We have come a long way since those humble days in Bethlehem. Maybe we have lost sight of the humble beginnings.

Advent and Christmas are about Jesus as the foundation of our faith. Mary's story can serve to remind us that our faith is not glitz and glitter. It is not about overspending and bountiful indulgence. Thinking about Mary reminds me about the simplicity of our faith. It is about following Christ and making him first in our lives. It is about listening to the Holy Spirit.

Advent is the season of preparation and expectation. We prepare to travel or we prepare for guests. We prepare for our friends and loved ones with gifts. We look forward to seeing people and hearing beautiful Christmas music. But, in our joy and celebration, have we glossed over Mary and her story? Have we missed the humility of Christ coming into this world?

In the Gospels, we find Jesus participating in celebrations. In fact, in John, Jesus' first public miracle was at the wedding at Cana, when he turned the water into wine. To celebrate, to gather with family and friends, or to give gifts is not wrong. Jesus modeled this behavior, but as we celebrate, let us be mindful of the reason. Caring about another person is a greater treasure than spending money on the latest gadget. We can spread God's love more effectively than any other way by listening to another person. Hearing what that person says and loving that person as Christ does is a profound gift.

Feasts and celebrations do not need to be lavish and extravagant. They can be simple. They can be God's people getting together and living out the words of 1 John 4:16b, "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them."
