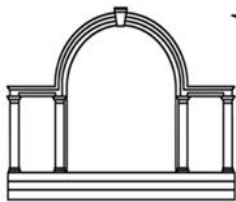

CHIMING OF THE HOUR

PRELUDE – *I Know That My Redeemer Lives* (Folk Hymn).....arr. Pethel

LIGHTING THE CANDLES

We open the Bible to remind us that God speaks to the people through the Holy Word.

CALL TO WORSHIP.....from Colossians 3:12-17 (NASB)

Leader: We who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, must put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience;

**People: We must bear with one another and forgive each other.**

Leader: And if we have a complaint against anyone, just as the Lord forgave us, we also should forgive.

**People: Above all else, we must put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity.**

Leader: Let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, to which indeed we were called in one body; and be thankful.

**People: Let the word of Christ richly dwell within us, with all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in our hearts to God.**

Leader: Whatever we do in word or deed, we do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father.

**People: Let us worship God now with Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual songs.**

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON ..... Ephesians 5:1-21 (NASB)

<sup>1</sup> Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; <sup>2</sup> and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma.

<sup>3</sup> But immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints; <sup>4</sup> and there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. <sup>5</sup> For this you know with certainty, that no immoral or impure person or covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God.

<sup>6</sup> Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. <sup>7</sup> Therefore do not be partakers with them; <sup>8</sup> for you were formerly darkness, but now you are Light in the Lord; walk as children of Light <sup>9</sup> (for the fruit of the Light consists in all goodness and righteousness and truth), <sup>10</sup> trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord.

<sup>11</sup> Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even expose them; <sup>12</sup> for it is disgraceful even to speak of the things which are done by them in secret. <sup>13</sup> But all things become visible when they are exposed by the light, for everything that becomes visible is light. <sup>14</sup> For this reason it says, "Awake, sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

<sup>15</sup> Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, <sup>16</sup> making the most of your time, because the days are evil. <sup>17</sup> So then do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. <sup>18</sup> And do not get drunk with wine, for that is dissipation, but be filled with the Spirit, <sup>19</sup> speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord; <sup>20</sup> always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father; <sup>21</sup> and be subject to one another in the fear of Christ.

Leader: This is the Word of the Lord!

**People: Thanks be to God!**
