## OLD TESTAMENT LESSON ...... 1 Samuel 16:1-13

<sup>1</sup>The Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king." <sup>2</sup>But Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me." The Lord said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the Lord.' <sup>3</sup>Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what to do. You are to anoint for me the one I indicate."

<sup>4</sup> Samuel did what the Lord said. When he arrived at Bethlehem, the elders of the town trembled when they met him. They asked, "Do you come in peace?" <sup>5</sup> Samuel replied, "Yes, in peace; I have come to sacrifice to the Lord. Consecrate yourselves and come to the sacrifice with me." Then he consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.

<sup>6</sup> When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed stands here before the Lord."

<sup>7</sup> But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

<sup>8</sup> Then Jesse called Abinadab and had him pass in front of Samuel. But Samuel said, "The Lord has not chosen this one either." <sup>9</sup> Jesse then had Shammah pass by, but Samuel said, "Nor has the Lord chosen this one." <sup>10</sup> Jesse had seven of his sons pass before Samuel, but Samuel said to him, "The Lord has not chosen these." <sup>11</sup> So he asked Jesse, "Are these all the sons you have?" "There is still the youngest," Jesse answered. "He is tending the sheep." Samuel said, "Send for him; we will not sit down until he arrives."

<sup>12</sup> So he sent for him and had him brought in. He was glowing with health and had a fine appearance and handsome features.

Then the Lord said, "Rise and anoint him; this is the one."

<sup>13</sup> So Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers, and from that day on the Spirit of the Lord came powerfully upon David. Samuel then went to Ramah.

#### **WORSHIP HOUR CHILDCARE**



# **LENT**

## A Time of Spiritual Renewal

Lent is the forty-day period (excluding Sundays) in the church year set aside for spiritual preparation for Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on the Saturday before Easter Sunday. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing himself for his earthly ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting, and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini Easter," and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with the joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

## Children's Mission Program Project

Each Wednesday night our Children's Mission Program will be assembling 12 bags of healthy, non-perishable food to go in weekend backpacks for children at Venable Elementary School. This backpack program at Venable provides meals and snacks for the weekend for families who are currently unable to provide meals for the family. ## **Intercessory Prayer Ministry**

The Intercessory Prayer Ministry at UBC began in October of 2001 under the direction of Tom Leland. At that time, he wrote, "I am convinced that this kind of prayer ministry will be spiritually enriching at both the individual and corporate (church-wide) levels. Why? Because we will be undertaking that which scripture calls us to do – 'pray without ceasing' (1 Thess. 5:17). Oswald Chambers really was on target when he said, 'Prayer does not equip us for the work of the church – prayer IS the work of the church."

There is a room on the third floor that is accessible only to intercessors. It is quiet and pleasant and contains all of the materials needed to facilitate this ministry. At any given time an intercessor will be in the Prayer Room praying for church members and their families and friends, visitors to the church, and complete strangers. They will be praying for people in every situation that individuals and families face on a daily basis. Intercessors also write notes of encouragement, PrayerGrams, to many of those they pray for.

One of the best things about the UBC Prayer Ministry is that the hour of the week you select can be a time which fits your schedule (even if it is an unorthodox hour!).
