Guidelines for UBC Health Ministry

Introduction

Our church is blessed to have a Health Ministry. The aim of this ministry is to promote wellness in body, mind and spirit through health education, care-giving and the healing message of the Christian gospel.

A. UBC Health Ministry Team

- 1) Team members are volunteers
- 2) Team size
 - a. The size of the team depends on the number of persons interested and/or the size of the congregation.
- 3) Team members are asked to serve by the church's nominating committee
 - a. Suggested persons to serve on the team include:
 - 1. Those who have shown an interest in health issues or concerns.
 - 2. People in the congregation with particular competence in health areas (e.g. doctors, registered nurses, social workers, health educators)
 - 3. Members interested in special ministries (e.g. youth and children, elderly, etc.)
 - 4. A member of the church's pastoral staff to serve as an advisor.
- 4) Team members offer the following services to UBC members:
 - a. Making phone calls and home visits to offer support during times of illness, grief, or other suffering.
 - b. Providing information on health promotion, disease prevention, and health/illness management.
 - c. Holding classes and clinics, such as blood pressure screenings and CPR classes, in response to the assessed needs of the congregation.
 - d. Providing transportation for doctor visits and medical treatments, when requested.
 - e. Offering assistance to hospital patients before and after surgery.
 - f. Serving as a patient advocate.
 - g. Providing referrals to pastoral ministries, congregational resources, and community services.
 - h. Counseling for individuals who have personal health concerns.
 - i. Focusing on the relationship between optimal spiritual, mental and physical well-being.
 - j. Maintaining first aid kits at UBC and keeping defibrillator battery up to date.

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- 5) The UBC Health Ministry <u>does not</u> replace or duplicate the services of hospice, home health, community health nursing, or other existing services in the community and congregation.
- 6) If you have a need for any of these services, please contact the church office (293-5106) for a referral to one of our Health Ministry team members.

B. Developing the Health Ministry Program

1) The team will guide the development of the health ministry as a program of the church.

C. Meetings of the Health Ministry

- 1) The Health Ministry team shall meet periodically as determined by the team and the focus of any planned health ministry activities.
- 2) Minutes of each meeting shall be distributed to all team members.
