This past Sunday, we had a young couple visit with us for the first time, staying A WORD FROM

after the service to eat and fellowship during the reception for Will and Erin Brown. Over and over, I observed different church members walking over to introduce themselves to these visitors, welcoming them in, encouraging them to take leftovers with them, and calling out that they hoped to see them again next Sunday. In the midst of a tender set of goodbyes, I watched you all offer an equally tender welcome to new faces. This is the beautiful cycle of our faith - living life together, watching people grow, and sending them off well and with love to whatever comes next. This love is what UBC does best, and I can't wait to watch you all continue to offer that love to the young people in our youth and college ministries in the new semester.

The plans are coming together for our fall semester at UBC with students in both our youth group and our college group! In the spring, we tested out a new schedule so that I could be fully present with both the youth and Jubilate groups on Sundays, an adjustment from having the two groups meet at the same time in past years. This new schedule worked well for both groups, also allowing Jubilate to do their rehearsals before eating rather than after dinner. We will be continuing this fall with youth meetings from 12:15 to 2:00 PM on Sunday afternoons, and Jubilate rehearsals from 5:00 to 6:30 PM on Sunday evenings.

The Legacy of Our Sanctuary Piano

When I came to UBC as organist in 1987, there was no piano in the Sanctuary. Usually, anthem accompaniments that were originally intended for piano had to be adapted to organ or, on the rare occasions when that wasn't feasible, we had to roll in an upright plano from one of the classrooms. Needless to say, piano solos for worship were non-existent. Then, in about 1988, Ray Gaines offered us his grandmother's piano on a long-term loan. Ray said "Len [Willingham] and Barbara were like two kids in a candy store the day it was brought in." Over the years, that piano has been treasured, moved about, played by numerous people, and used over and over again in worship. During the four months the Sanctuary was under renovation in 1990, the piano lived in Fellowship Hall as our only worship instrument. It served that purpose again in 2012 when the organ was flooded by the AC system and spent the whole summer in storage while the area was repaired and dried. Having such a nice piano has opened up possibilities for worship and many styles of anthem accompaniments. It has been used for choral accompaniments in concert as well as solo piano recitals. While we have been able to take a step forward and secure a larger instrument that will be a bit more concert-worthy, we aren't saying goodbye to our friend. "She" will continue to lead in worship and other functions in the Fellowship Hall. We are very fortunate to be home to three grand pianos and the musical opportunities that presents. At this point of transition, however, we wanted to take a moment to thank Ray for his generosity in continuing to allow us the use of the Knabe and wish it many more years of service to this church and God's Kingdom. - Barbara Moore
