What is Your Rule?

Last week, I wrote about the monastic rule of life. The "rule" is a way to say, "This is who we are. This is our story and what is important to us." We all live by certain rules, whether we acknowledge them or not. When monastic communities adopt a rule, they are attempting to be intentional about how they live. We can follow this pattern as individuals and in groups.

Last Wednesday night, we talked about a rule of life. We explored the implications from various rules of life and thought about how the groups developed them. We imagined what it might look like to live with a rule. Then, each table developed one rule for the week. One table wanted to "find 5 times to pray for another member of their table each day." Another made their rule very clear, "If anyone asks for help, we will say 'yes'." Several other groups shied away from a concrete, actionable rule. One table focused on "gratitude" and another on being "welcoming." One emphasized being "gracious" and "honest."

This week, on Wednesday, we will explore what it meant to live with these rules. For example, if the rule was, "Be honest," what happened when someone wearing an ugly sweater said, "How do you like my sweater?"

Setting silly examples aside, crafting a rule to glorify God and edify the body of Christ is hard. "Be honest" might sound good when we think about being honest with our faith or honest with ourselves. All rules of life begin with self-reflection. A person or community must answer the question, "Who am I?" If we don't know who we are, then we don't have a basis for understanding a rule like, "Be honest." Did it stem from a desire to be true to oneself, or was it a response to others who withheld their thoughts or feelings?

One of the books I read when I began serving Hickory Baptist Church in North Carolina was a practical guide to platform protocols for ministers during a worship service. The author said, "Never cross your legs... Don't shove too many pieces of paper in your Bible..." Everything seemed to go back to looking professional and building one's career. The author focused on finding a bigger church. When I wrote my first rule of life, the first part was a response to the idea of focusing on bigger churches instead of following Christ. Now, whenever I return to the rule and see that line, "Be open to anything God may call me to do, no matter how insane or outlandish it may sound," it still speaks to me.

What's your rule? I hope to see you on Wednesday as we continue discussing the rule of life.
