Radical Hospitality and You!

Last year, our goals for the year included spiritual growth, gathering and reengagement, and making a difference in the lives of our neighbors. In many ways, we accomplished our goals. Among our many activities in 2022, some included a big kick-off event for Sunday Morning Bible Study and several new study groups. We picked up trash for a mission project and had an ice cream social. More people engaged with youth, Jubilate, and our collegiate ministries. And many groups used our space.

Now, we are forming our goals for this year. The Church Council will be discussing them this week. Spiritual growth will likely remain part of our goal. Instead of reengagement, perhaps our focus will shift to building deeper relationships and engaging with one another. Making a difference in our community seems to embody our sense of calling, so it will likely continue in some form, too. However, I want to add radical hospitality to our goals.

Recently, I was a vicarious recipient of radical hospitality from The Church by the Sea, Fort Lauderdale, FL, and its pastor Chris Reny. They only planned to be there for a week, but this has stretched on a bit.

When I realized that they would be anchored in Lake Sylvia, in Fort Lauderdale, over Christmas, I looked for a church to recommend to them for Christmas Eve. A quick search on Google Maps led me to The Church by the Sea. It is on the water and a short dinghy ride from their anchorage. I called the church and introduced myself to their pastor. The

Birthday Cake Kits for the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank

Can you imagine having a child or other loved one who is having a birthday and not being able to give them a birth-

day cake? Birthdays are meant to be celebrated, but in the past few years many people have fallen on hard financial times, and that shouldn't be a reason not to celebrate.

Did you know that you can make a cake with just a cake mix and a lemon lime soda? You can!

Items to include in a birthday cake kit:

- 9x13 disposable aluminum foil pan the ones that come with lids are nice, but not absolutely necessary
- a box of cake mix (any flavor you like)
- 1 can of Sprite or other lemon-lime soda (store brand will work) in case the recipient doesn't have eggs or oil
- container of icing
- birthday candles
- include a large note that says:

Birthday Cake Kit:

You can make a cake without oil or eggs just by mixing the cake mix with the lemon-lime soda. Then bake according to the directions on the back of the cake mix box. "Happy Birthday!"

Pack it all in the aluminum pan and wrap it up with Saran wrap.

Collection boxes will be located in the first-floor lobby and on the stage in the fellowship hall (while we are hosting PACEM, there will not be a collection box in the fellowship hall). We will collect through Sunday, January 29.

Offering for Global Missions

During the month of December, we normally collect donations for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's Offering for Global Missions. Since early this year, our focus has been on ways we can provide relief and assistance to those missionaries who are working in Ukraine or working with the refugees who have fled that country.

For this year, we are going to direct our Global Missions offering to the CBF Ukraine Relief Fund. 100% of your gifts will support the long-term presence of CBF field personnel serving the Ukrainian people. Our offering goal at UBC is to contribute \$3,000 toward this CBF fund.
