Barmen Today

In May 1934, representatives from German churches met to write a "common message for the church today." The Nazi party was growing and wanted to infiltrate and take over German Protestant churches. The document they produced became known as the Barmen Declaration.

The Barmen Declaration has six points:

- 1."Jesus Christ, as he is attested for us in Holy Scripture, is the one Word of God which we have to hear and which we have to trust and obey in life and in death" (8.11). This statement is followed by a rejection of other sources of God's revelation, like political figures, for example (8.12).2. Jesus is "God's assurance" of forgiveness (8.14), and we reject false authorities (8.15).
- 3. The message and order of the church should not be influenced by the current political convictions.
- 4. "The various offices in the church do not establish a dominion of some

over the others; on the contrary, they are for the exercise of the ministry

- entrusted to and enjoined upon the whole congregation" (8.20). In other words, the "Führer" should not rule the church (8.21).
- 5. "Fear God. Honor the emperor." (1 Peter 2:17b). There should be a separation of church and state (8.23-24).
- 6. The mission of the church is to share a message of the free grace of God to all people (8.26), and the declaration rejects subordination of the church by the state (8.27).

In an age when autocracies are on the rise around the world, Barth's words from 1934 sound fresh. Christians live as resident aliens (1 Peter 2:11). We are in the world but not of the

world (John 15:18-19). We might hear calls to patriotism or to putting our home country first, but God calls us to put Jesus Christ first. This is a repeated theme in our Sunday study of 1 Corinthians and comes up again this week in 1 Corinthians 3.1-9.

As we approach the first anniversary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine, I thought about Germany's expansion efforts in the late 1930's. What is the theological response to an autocrat like Vladimir Putin? I can see the tension around supporting Ukraine's military defenses. We, in the United States, have domestic issues that require resources. We continue to live in a polarized political climate. And the risk of escalation with a nuclear power is real. What do we do?

In moments like these, I am thankful that my answer must be limited to the theological sphere. I am not a politician, nor am I a political scientist. So, I turn back to scripture. Instead of letting any political leader become Lord of my life, it's supposed to be Jesus. Our Baptist principle of "separation of church and state" makes sense.

Without letting the voices around us dictate what we say, how we pray, or what we do in church, we focus on following God. We proclaim freedom for the captives and justice for the oppressed. We share God's grace and promote peace in Christ. I am still trying to figure out what this means we should say about Russia's invasion of Ukraine. As the first anniversary approaches, I am praying for God's guidance to find a message of hope for this broken world.
