Did you eat today? To most of us on this newsletter distribution list, this might seem like a silly question. Some of us actually try to eat less. For most of us, it's not a question of whether or not we get enough to eat. Sometimes, the question is, "What am I in the mood to eat?"

Even though there is enough food in the world to feed everyone, over 800 million people go to bed hungry each day. According to the UN, almost 3.1 billion people could not afford a healthy diet in 2020. This was an increase of 112 million from 2019. The increase reflects the effects of inflation in consumer food prices.

Setting aside all of the other problems in the world, how can we celebrate God's wonderful world when so many people are hungry? We celebrate because God is at work. Through people's actions and generosity, God is addressing this crisis.

Last Saturday, we got to be part of God's answer. Around 65 people gathered in the fellowship hall for our first Rise Against Hunger event. We had a blast packing 12,528 meals. Another way to think about it is this: each of the 58 boxes represents an entire year's worth of meals for a starving child. Feeding kids means they can concentrate and learn when they go to school instead of thinking about their empty bellies. If we help children learn, then they will have more opportunities in the future.
