## 2022 Missions Discretionary Fund

The Missions Council would like to thank the congregation for allowing us to include a Missions Discretionary Fund in the budget again this year. This allows us to address needs that arise during the year, both in our neighborhood, and around the world. We spend time in each of our monthly meetings discussing ideas for how the money could be used. In 2022 our focus ended up being a mix of local agencies and state and national CBF efforts. Thank you for the opportunity to share with the following organizations on your behalf in 2022.

- \$2,000 to the CBF Disaster Response Hurricane Fund, specifically for aid in Puerto Rico after Hurricane Fiona.
- \$1,500 to our Venable Food Bag program to ensure we have funds to cover this ongoing mission project to supply bags of food over the weekend to the children of families at Venable Elementary School who are economically disadvantaged.
- \$600 to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Ukraine Relief Fund to assist field personnel who are working to provide relief to Ukrainians impacted by the war.

# **Our Sunday Morning Bible Studies**

I took a few weeks off giving information about and encouraging everyone to participate in Sunday morning Bible Study. I want to continue my thanks and praise to all of our Bible Study Leaders. Without accolades, they each prepare for and present a challenging look at selected Scriptures which encourage us to grow in our faith.

We have some exciting things in the works as we continue our emphasis on studying God's Word with fellow believers. Please find a class that meets your needs and join this Sunday!

Our Youth Bible Study is for students from 6th-12th grade. Students examine the big ideas of the Bible, talking about current topics like justice, ecology, race, and inclusion, through the lens of the Bible. The Youth meet Sundays at 9:45 on the third floor in Room 305 and are led by David Waters (A reliable source has revealed he brings goodies, too!)

The College Bible Study class is for young adults who have graduated from high school and are in the general college age range (but not all of our members are students!) Anyone in the 18-23ish range is welcome. Each semester, they pick a topic or book of the Bible and dig deep into the scripture together, examining small sections each week, taking lots of time to answer questions and chase rabbit trails, and think about how the scripture speaks to our own lives now. The leader is Rev. Val Fisk, and they meet in the College Room G 17 (ground floor).

The "Kairos Class" is an adult coed group that is led by Scott Miller and now meets in Room 117 on the first floor. The lessons are discussion oriented and Q & A guided, based on lessons in the *Nurturing Faith magazine*. These lessons are brilliantly written by Biblical scholar, Dr. Tony Cartledge, and are based on the Revised Common Lectionary.
