# Ordination

# **WATCH**

What is the process by which God calls ministers in our tradition? Many of you are probably familiar with it. Others might have been to ordination services but don't know about the journey to that point.

Baptist churches are autonomous. We have no ecclesial (or church) authority above our local congregation. We don't have a bishop, presbyter, or conference. We join with other Baptist churches as a fellowship because we can do more together than we can do apart. However, the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship holds no authority over our congregation.

Thus, when Christ-followers feel God calling them into ordained ministry, in our tradition, their first step is to share this good news with their church. When we first started talking with Megan Sharp about coming to serve as our Associate Minister for Music and College Students, I asked her if she ever thought about the ordination for ministry.

My question arrived long after the Holy Spirit had been working in her life. Her journey began when she was a child, and God has been using her throughout her adolescence and adult life. Her previous roles in music ministry were not typically held by ordained clergy, so coming to UBC brought her to new territory.

As she began her ministry at UBC, she began praying about God's leading in her life, and she asked the question, "Am I called to ordained ministry?" She and I talked about it. She met regularly with the

Rev. Susan Deal and prayerfully considered whether to pursue ordination.

Megan read and they discussed Walter Shurden's book The Four Fragile Freedoms. As part of this process, Megan wrote reflection essays on: (a) her sense of God's calling, (b) Bible freedom, (c) soul freedom, (d) church freedom, and (e) religious freedom. Then, in January, she told me she felt God calling her to ordained ministry. Following the guidelines in the UBC bylaws, we discussed her sense of calling with the deacons and assembled an Ordination Council. The Ordination Council is Kevin Adams (moderator & ordained chaplain), Jaden Bernard (college student), Diana Brawley (ordained Presbyterian minister and longtime friend), Gary Dalton (UBC member and ordained minister). Laura Davis (CBFVA co-coordinator), Ingrid Flaherty (choir member), Ray Gaines (deacon chair & choir member), Lily Gregg (search committee chair and choir member), Hadessah Johnson (college student), Larry Johnson (choir member), Carolyn Lowry (choir member), Alden Pinkham (deacon and choir member), Roy Thomas (UBC member and ordained minister), and Ellie Weikle (longtime friend).

We met with Megan on Thursday, March 20, at 7pm. We had a wonderful discussion, and the Ordination Council voted unanimously to recommend Megan for ordination to the gospel ministry of Jesus Christ. At the conclusion of our worship service on March 30, we will have a called Church Conference to vote on the recommendation of the Ordination Council. If the congregation votes to approve Megan's ordination, we will plan an ordination service for Saturday, April 5.

Seeing God at work is such a privilege, and ordaining someone into ministry is something to celebrate. I hope this brings you as much joy as it brought me.

#### CBF Offering for National Missions Organizing Churches to Embrace the Impoverished

We are continuing to collect donations for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship offering for National Missions. Our UBC Missions Council has chosen to send our offering directly to the Reverend Scarlette Jasper who serves the people of southeastern Kentucky and eastern Tennessee.

The CBF program *Together for Hope*, a rural development coalition to combat poverty, now serves 301 of the poorest counties in the United States. Scarlette serves ten of those counties, expending her energy to alleviate poverty's dismal destruction by organizing churches to embrace the homeless by providing, among many other things, clothing, hot meals, shelter, free health clinics, and weekend food bags.

Scarlette's home is in Somerset, Kentucky where her husband Brian was born and raised. When Jasper was commissioned as field personnel in 2014, her commissioning stipulated that she had to raise her own support including salary and project and programming funds. "My husband provided my needs." This offering now helps fund the salaries, benefits, and housing for field personnel who must still raise support for their project and programs. Not long after the CBF's funding model changed, in 2019, her husband Brian died. Her son Roger is a Baptist minister in Somerset. She still has a daughter at home and three grandchildren.

Our goal here at UBC is to contribute \$3,000 toward the larger CBF goal. You can do so by check, noting that it is for National Missions, or online <u>here.</u>

Church was started, it was within walking distance. Dr. Northern, from Four Mile Creek in Richmond, preached a revival there, and 28 people were baptized, including me. The church meant so much to so many, and our faith grew very strong there. My favorite Sunday School teacher at that time was Mrs. W. H. Sadler. I learned more from her than from anybody else except my mother and father." "Years later, many of us helped found the University Baptist Church. I can still remember the excitement as we saw the building go up."


