# Love Your Neighbor

# **©WATCH**

At the center of our faith is Jesus' commandment to love our neighbor as ourselves. In Mark 12:28-31, a scribe asked Jesus which is the greatest commandment. Jesus quoted the familiar words, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." Then, Jesus added a second commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." He explained that this second one is more important than all the other commandments.

We live in a time when this command to love our neighbor is challenged in many ways. People find obstacles to put up between them. Xenophobia, homophobia, sexism, racism, ableism, and others feel like they are becoming commonplace. Into this landscape, God calls us to love our neighbor.

In 2023, as Haiti descended into chaos, the U.S. government enacted a humanitarian parole program that allowed Haitians who feared the violence to come to our country legally. If a Haitian had an American sponsor, they could come to the U.S. for 3 years. I learned about the program when a Haitian friend reached out and asked me to sponsor her. She came to the U.S. in early 2023, joined our church, and, after getting her work visa, she obtained two jobs. She did all of this legally and is a contributing member of our community. [I am not putting her name in this space for her protection.]

To me, when she asked if we would sponsor her, the answer seemed obvious—not because I'm

anything special, but because welcoming the foreigner is central to our faith (Exodus 23:9). To "love one's neighbor" includes helping them if it is possible to do so. Now, the U.S. government has ended the humanitarian parole program for people from Cuba, Haiti, Venezuela, and Nicaragua. This jeopardizes the legal status of nearly 1.5 million immigrants in the U.S., including the one who has been part of our church family.

How do we "love our neighbor" now? God's calling hasn't changed, so I don't know the answer. My commentary isn't related to politics. It reflects belief in a God who is beyond national borders. I want to love my neighbor, whether she is from Haiti, Palestine, Israel, Russia, Ukraine, or wherever. So how do we show that love in a world that seems so committed to separating people from one another?

For me, these questions are and will continue to be the subject of my prayers and contemplation. If you have any ideas, I would love to hear them.
