Vote Jesus Christ NWATCH

Starting tomorrow (October 2, 2024), we will welcome back Scott Spencer. He will be sharing throughout the month of October about his new book *Vote Jesus Christ: A Political Riff on Luke's Gospel and Cautionary Tale for Evangelicals and Other Concerned Citizens.* We have copies of the book for anyone who wants one. They are available in the church office, and we will have them in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesday evening. (If you want to pay for it, after you pick up your book, give the church \$16.)

Spencer organizes the book around twelve strategies. For example, the first one is, "Don't put yourself forward for public office or service. Seek only to serve God and answer God's call to serve others. God 'elects' the servant-leader(s) of God's people." In the chapter, he explores Jesus' birth and growth into ministry. When he enters his ministry, Jesus isn't jealous of John or anxious about who he is. He knows. He is the Messiah.

Recognizing our calling is part of the journey of self-realization, Spencer places contemporary American politics alongside Luke's Jesus. When held in this light, we can see how most people fall short of what is possible in a democracy. Self-interest, personal gain, and ego get in the way of serving the public.

To anyone who fears a title like *Vote Jesus Christ* veers too close to politics coming into the church, I agree. Instead, let's bring the church into politics. What does our faith tell us about how

You may have noticed the merry band of children climbing the steep balcony stairs and disappearing into the Children's Suite on Sunday mornings lately. You might be wondering, what exactly are they doing up there? While some things are genuine mysteries, like why God chooses to show up when and where God does, this phenomenon need not be one! And so, in a series of stories, I'd like to share with you about how UBCKids are worshiping and wondering these days.

Children Worshiping



The story of Worship+Wonder starts back in 2016, when my kids were little, but too big to go to the nursery at our new church in Fredericksburg. "How would they

learn about what worship is?" I wondered aloud to our children's minister, Erin. Asking the question got me thinking, maybe I could teach them.

When you want to teach a young person something important, especially something as important as how to worship, it helps to break it down into steps, with each new step being built on the last. I looked at our order of worship as it was printed in our bulletin, and I saw seven steps, each part of the four big movements of our worship service. (The four movements of worship, as I had learned in seminary, as old as the church itself, are Gathering - Hearing - Responding - and Sending.) The seven steps in our weekly worship were: 1) Gathering, 2) Praising, 3) Praying, 4) Forgiving, 5) Hearing the Story, 6) Giving, and 7) Sending. Different churches put these in different sequences. Churches also add an eighth step, 8) Feasting, every week, once a month, or once a quarter. Naming these steps helped me to see that I could teach my kids how to worship! I just needed to teach it one step at a time.

It is also helpful to remember that when you want a young person to learn to do something.



On Wednesday, we will begin looking at the book, *Vote Jesus Christ* by F. Scott Spencer. Our discussion will be led by the author, Scott Spencer. This is a fun and fascinating book describing the Jesus of the Gospel of Luke as if he were running for public office.

Strange as it sounds, it is in fact a genius way to show how Jesus was campaigning for God, God's kingdom, and God's people to live a new kind of story—not according to the cut-throat politics of the world but based on the theme of love for God and love for neighbor.

And their practice will need to be guided and coached in the beginning, until they learn to do the skills on their own. In fact, you will know that a young person has learned a skill when they can teach it to you! It also helps to use tools they can touch and images they can see. And so, I set about making worship bags with my kids. These bags were special, and they were unique to them. They were not full of distractions, things that pulled them away from worship and out of the moment. They were intentionally stocked with tools that helped them BE fully present in worship, engaged in the wonder of the moment.

In this series of Wonder-ings, I'd like to share the stories of each item in our worship bags. The children of UBC are building their bags in Worship+Wonder this fall with tangible tools and practiced skills. You might not think that you ever had such a bag, but you do! Your bag may not be tangible - canvas, with your name on it - but it is unique to you. Someone taught you how to do these things. Someone gave you the tools you needed to participate in your own way. Someone guided your practice until you could do it on your own. And someone gave you a chance to teach them, or someone else, how to do these things.

And now, there is nothing left to do but to begin...
