In this series of Word articles, <u>Elizabeth Dowdy</u> explains what *Worship+Wonder* is and how it is teaching our children to engage the parts of our worship services.

The first step in our worship each and every Sunday is to **gather**. I have come to think of this as having two interdependent parts. It is essential that **we gather with each other** as the family of God. This was what we missed when we were in the lockdown time of the pandemic. We are social beings, made to be together! When we are isolated and cut off from other human beings, we wither. When we are connected, we thrive!

A second, equally important part of gathering for worship, it seems to me, happens when we **gather ourselves**, or more appropriately, our selves. Now, I don't know about you, but I am made up of lots of different parts - my mom-parts worry about dinner and laundry while my work-parts worry about emails and tasks. I also have family and relationship parts, creative parts and regretful parts. It takes some work to put all these parts together into one body and one soul, and show up, with all of them, in the presence of God. When I can do this act of gathering my *self*, I feel grounded and clear. When I can't, I feel scattered and cloudy.

Fortunately, there are two things we do when we worship that help us to gather. The first is simple: we show up. At least 90% of life is showing up! The second thing we do to help us gather is a little tougher, but it can be learned: we settle. We settle our bodies onto pew cushions. We settle our phones (most of the time) in our bags or our pockets. We settle our worries and our distractions. We settle our breath. We settle our hearts. We settle our minds. We show up and we settle. That is how we gather for worship.



Kids don't have much control over when they come to church. For the showing-up step, they depend on you. They need you to show them how to show up, when to show up, and why you show up. To help you, their grown-ups, keep them showing up, we make a Worship Bag the first time they come to Worship+Wonder. It has their name on

it. It is unique to them. They get to color on it. At first, it lives in our Worship+Wonder space, while it is being filled with tools. Eventually, it will go home with them and come to church with them every time they come for worship. Someday in the distant future, they will outgrow it and forget it in a closet, because they will no longer need its contents to do their worship, but for now, it waits for them to show up, each Sunday to discover what will be added next.



For the settling step, kids make something we call a Mindfulness Jar, though it goes by many different names. When the jar is shaken up, it mimics the anxious brain, full of distraction and worry. When kids watch the glitter inside slowly drift to the bottom, they are practicing the age-old practice of centering

prayer (also known as meditation or mindfulness). As we talk through settling our bodies, our words, and our breath, we are causing our brains to mimic the falling and settling glitter, allowing our limbic system to self-regulate. And, just like the jar, clear space begins to open up at the top for seeing clearly, thinking clearly, and hearing clearly.

And now, we are ready to worship...


