Building Bridges

Another election year drags on in this divided nation. For us, the great quest remains overcoming that which divides us from other people. Jesus said, "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:31). Too often, instead of loving one another, we first notice our differences. During this election season, those differences are often political. If we see someone exhibiting enthusiastic support for one candidate, the temptation is to stop seeing the person as a child of God. Instead, people see one another with political labels. How can we overcome these differences?

When Jesus said, "Love your neighbor as yourself," he didn't offer a list of exceptions. He did not say, "Love these neighbors, but not those." Likewise, when Jesus said, "For God so loved the world..." (John 3:16), he did not limit the parts of the world God loves. God loves everyone, and those of us who claim to follow Jesus need to love everyone, too.

This theme repeats throughout scripture (Ephesians 4:32, Hebrews 12:14, Colossians 1:20, etc.). In 2 Corinthians 5:18, we find a connection between our reconciliation to God and the way we practice a ministry of reconciliation. Since God reconciles us through Christ, God calls us to practice a ministry of reconciliation. In these divided times, God is calling us to find creative ways to build bridges with others.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES PROJECT

School Supplies Project

To begin school this coming school year 2024-2025, according to the Woodbrook Elementary School website, the average cost of the suggested supply lists for all grades is over \$58 per student - a 19% increase

over the cost from just a year ago. Over eighty percent of the Woodbrook families are on public assistance and cannot afford to buy their children what they need. The financial hardships added by the pandemic and sky-rocketing inflation have compounded the needs of these children. In 2008, Love INC paired the UBC WMU with the Family Support Workers at Woodbrook Elementary. In the beginning we asked you to bring in a variety of school supplies that we sorted and delivered to the school. This method was pretty chaotic. For the last 16 years, we have asked you to donate money. We asked the Family Support Workers what things they specifically needed, and then we purchased those supplies and delivered them to the school. The Woodbrook Family Support Workers were delighted with this more efficient method. We want to continue to meet the needs of the less fortunate children "... to give [them] hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11). Dinner with Andrew

He had been working at Domino's Pizza at the time, and his coworkers wanted to do something to honor his memory. This year is the twenty-fourth year Colleen has been collecting donations in Andrew's memory. In 2020, she switched from collecting and sorting food to taking donations for food gift cards. She gives these cards to families in extreme need through The Jefferson Area Food Bank, The Salvation Army, The Emergency Food Bank, and ARC.
