UBC Bereavement Ministry

As one of the components of UBC's Circle of Caring, initiated by the Deacons a couple of years ago, the Bereavement Team served its first bereaved family in May 2012. Our first team leader, Elva Ferguson, and husband Wayne took our first Bereavement Basket to this family. The Basket has become our symbol of caring at a difficult time for our bereaved families. It contains a variety of practical gifts — paper goods, plastic utensils, tea bags, coffee, notebooks and pens, kleenex, toilet paper, trash can liners, etc. — items that the household might need with extra guests arriving suddenly. The notebooks, for example, are helpful in recording phone messages and visitors to the home, as well as flowers, food, and other gifts that are brought or delivered, and are very helpful when the time comes to write thank-you notes.



After I became team leader in November of last fall, UBC families have experienced six deaths in six months and we have delivered nine Bereavement Baskets (multi-generational situations may require an extra basket). We have also offered (and provided as requested) house-sitting during visitations and funerals while all family members are occupied elsewhere; and we have attempted to be good listeners/shoulders to cry on as the need arises. While we decided at the outset to not be responsible for receptions *per se*, but are willing to assist family members in contacting others who may help in this or other ways. We work closely with UBC staff, deacons, and funeral homes as needed.

Each situation is different; each family has its own traditions, ways of handling grief, and time tables. Indeed, sometimes support is needed just as much or more AFTER the funeral than before. We always try to call before we visit the home, giving the bereaved a choice at a time when so much is not under their control. Recently our team (currently there are twelve of us) decided that each of us will choose a bereaved family for ongoing contacts and support for at least one year following the death of their loved one. The first anniversary of the death is an important event for the bereaved, and most hope that others will remember with them, call their loved one by name, and otherwise acknowledge that their loved one lived and mattered.
