Looking Ahead

Three weeks and a day or two into 2018... What will this year hold? Hope. Excitement. Adventures. New friends. Reunions with old friends. Happy times. Spiritual growth. Kindness. Warmth. Love. Generosity. Patience. Or... Loss. Sadness. Disappointment. Frustration. Irritation. Pettiness.

We cannot know what the future holds. We can have a sense of what might happen. For example, if one were close to completing a program of study, one might look ahead to graduation. But, things can change. I had a friend who took a class in college during his last semester. It was a required course. He had already taken it and passed it with a 'C'. He took it again to fill out his schedule and to have the opportunity to learn more about the subject. At some point in the semester, the excitement of graduation and next steps took hold.

My friend lost interest in this required course. Since he had passed it earlier, he thought that he had fulfilled the requirement. He stopped giving it much attention. Then, he stopped going to class. By the end of the semester, he had stopped turning in assignments and did not bother taking the final. The post-graduation stage of his life took his energy and focus. He failed the class. "No big deal," he thought, "because I already took and passed it."

A few days before graduation, the registrar broke the news to my friend. The most recent grade in a course is the one that counts. He would not be graduating in May. Instead, he retook the course (now, his third time in it). He earned an 'A' and graduated during the following commencement ceremony.

My friend thought that year would go one way. It was very different. In the end, he experienced the joy of graduation but he learned some valuable lessons along the way. His experience taught me some important lessons. We must maintain focus, keep trying, and not take things for granted.

As we look ahead in 2018, what will the year hold for our church? What is God saying to us? Where is God leading us? If we keep the status quo, take our things for granted, or lose our focus, setbacks and twists along the path might be ahead of us. Let us look to God this year. Let us move in faith. Let us keep a fresh-focus on what God is saying and where God is leading us.
