OLD TESTAMENT LESSON - Psalm 22:23-31 (NRSV) ......Rachel Miller <sup>23</sup>You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel! <sup>4</sup> For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; he did not hide his face from me, but heard when I cried to him. <sup>5</sup> From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him.  $^{26}$  The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord. May your hearts live forever!  $^{27}$  All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. <sup>28</sup> For dominion belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations. <sup>29</sup> To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him. <sup>30</sup> Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord, <sup>31</sup> and proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it. GOSPEL LESSON - Luke 24:36b-48 (NRSV) ......Sarah Wilson <sup>36</sup> ...Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." <sup>37</sup> They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. <sup>38</sup> He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? <sup>39</sup> Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." <sup>40</sup> And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. <sup>41</sup>While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" <sup>42</sup> They gave him a piece of broiled fish, 43 and he took it and ate in their presence.  $^{44}$ Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." <sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, <sup>46</sup> and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of these things.
