Becoming a *More* Welcoming Congregation

I would like to invite you to think back to your first experience in the church. Did your parents bring you? Did you grow up in the church? If you cannot remember your first experience in church, think back to your first experience at University Baptist Church. Who invited you? Or, who brought you to church? Where did you become involved? What type of service or activity did you first attend?

How did you feel about those early experiences with the church? What made you feel welcome? Did you have any difficulties to overcome? Could you find everything? Did someone show you around? Did you feel warmth or sense the presence of the Holy Spirit? This thought exercise prepares us to be a more welcoming congregation. I write "more" in italics because University Baptist is already welcoming. We welcome in the stranger, feed the hungry, house the homeless, and engage in a number of ministries. But, we could be more welcoming. We could be warmer. We could be more engaging, more proactive in our approach to guests who enter God's house at 1223 W Main St.

Why is it important to be a welcoming congregation? In each of us, there is a longing for God. The psalmist writes,

"My soul longs, indeed it faints, for the courts of the Lord" (Psalm 84:2). With this desire for God in each of us, we have an opportunity to find God when we gather together for worship. When we come together, we find the glory of the Lord, "A day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere" (Psalm 84:10). As a welcoming congregation, we draw people into God's "courts" and they can experience the joy we find in God.

Being a welcoming congregation is a lifestyle. It is looking around the church with fresh eyes. When a first-time visitor asks for help finding, the restroom, do we take the person and show them? If so, is that the end of it? Or, do we make a note that someone was unable to find the restroom? Do we work with the building and grounds committee to make the restroom more visible? Does it need better signage?

Applying the same principle to every encounter with a first-time visitor will yield a more welcoming environment. We will gradually find the silent ways we present obstacles and barriers to finding God's "courts" at University Baptist Church. When we do, we can remove these obstacles. We can draw people in. And, we can become a *more* welcoming congregation.

Church Affiliation Update From Church Council

Several months ago the Baptist General Association of Virginia (our state affiliation) announced that they will no longer support Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (our national affiliation through which we support mission efforts). At that time, Church Council voted to suspend UBC's payments to BGAV while we gather more information about the situation and review our current affiliations. Meanwhile, these payments are being held in escrow.

Our Senior Minister has attended the annual conventions of BGAV and

Alliance of Baptists, and will attend the CBF convention in a couple of weeks. Our goal is to align UBC with ministry and missions organizations that most closely reflect our values. Matt will summarize and lead us in discussions when he has gathered all relevant information.

We will continue to send money to CBF while these discussions take place. In the end, all funds designated for missions in the budget will go to missions. Please keep Matt and the leaders of BGAV and CBF in your prayers during this ongoing matter as we seek God's will for University Baptist Church.
