Being Visitor-Friendly (& Acronyms)

Last week, I asked everyone to think about their first experience in church. The exercise is aimed at helping us become a more welcoming congregation. It is not a criticism of how welcoming we are. It is the recognition that we can improve. We can be friendlier. We can draw people in, get them involved, and expand our family of faith. When we do, everyone benefits.

We have many visitors come through our sanctuary on Sundays. Some are in Charlottesville for a short time. Others have moved here and are shopping for a new church home. Some might be checking church out for the first time, or others might be recovering from a bad church experience. What can we do to be more visitor-friendly? How can we make them feel welcome?

A visitor-friendly church is free of insider jargon and acronyms. At this point, any good feeling that we are already welcoming should fade. We have insider jargon. We have acronyms. If we need to hand someone a codebook to understand our worship or church life, we are doing it wrong. There will always be church-words, like grace, faith, mercy, and Holy Trinity. (The last one remains a mystery for many life-long church-going Christians!)

A person should feel drawn into the UBC family without needing a 400-level course on the church. 1 Corin-

thians 14:33 says, "God is a God not of disorder but of peace." We all want to share God's love and grace. To us, the church makes sense. The challenge is to see it with fresh eyes and assess what obstacles there are to sharing God's grace.

How long would it take a first-time visitor to figure out what the following sentence means? *After JARC, we will have VBS, and a new group will lead PACEM but OIAM will still have the same coordinator.* To a new member, it appears nonsensical. For some members, it is unintelligible.

We can look at each part of our church life and analyze its visitor-friendliness. Put on fresh eyes and imagine how someone who is new might see something. Take a Sunday worship bulletin. Go through it. If you did not have a sense of worship flow, would you be able to follow it?

When you see a new person, say, "I'm so glad you are here. As a church, we are trying to be more visitor-friendly. Has anything been confusing this morning or did not make sense?"

Most people will say, "Thank you," and "Everything makes sense."

But, you can get lucky! Someone could answer and tell you something that does not make sense. If so, tell a minister. Try to figure out a way to make whatever was confusing clearer. Ask the person, "How can we do better?"

We all want to be a visitor-friendly church. We all want to be welcoming. Wanting it is not the same as making honest assessments and finding ways to improve.

God loves every person very, very much. Let us find a way to communicate that love to every person in our community.
