1 Guide my feet while I run this race;
(yes, my Lord!)

The fourth system concludes with a quarter note D6, a half note E6, and a quarter note F6. The piano accompaniment remains consistent.

2 Hold my hand ... 3 Stand by me ...

This African American spiritual is based on the imagery of "the race that is set before us" in Hebrews 12:1-2. Its call-and-response structure allows for the improvisation and addition of stanzas related to an athletic metaphor that is as vivid today as it was centuries ago.

Commissioning of the Tangier Island Mission Trip

Tangier Island is a small island in the Chesapeake Bay. It is made of sandy ridges divided by marshes and tidal streams. A little over 700 people call it home. The island suffers from poverty and the land is under constant threat from erosion and rising sea levels. The youth group, led by Sarah Wilson, is partnering with the youth from Swain Memorial United Methodist Church on the island.

The UBC youth will spend next week getting to know students who live in a very different place. The island has virtually no cell service, few stores, no movie theater. With God's help, our youth and the Tangier youth will find that we are all God's children and they will grow in Christ together. Our youth will work on a number of projects around the island.

Our gospel lesson today provides the framework for why we go. In Mark 6:7, we see Jesus sending out the disciples. As his disciples today, we go where he sends us. Today, we send this group out: Isabella Canseco, Carter Groff, Joey Hamel, Kelly Kossi, Zach Martindale, Audrey Miller, Leah Miller, Christian Proffitt, Dean Tennant, Eddy Tennant, Will Wagoner, Sarah Wilson, Morgan Wagoner, Matt Tennant, and Larry Johnson.

Leader: Mission Team, is it your desire that University Baptist Church commission you to this mission work on Tangier Island?

Mission Team: God is calling. We seek to answer that call and be God's light on Tangier Island next week.

Leader: Do you dedicate yourselves to the mission task before you on Tangier Island, Virginia, and in doing whatever God may lead you to do during this time away from home and family?
