What is an ‘inviting church’?

In my last article, I looked at some of the reasons people do not invite others to church. Compartmentalizing different facets of life, insecurity, and relevance of church were all reasons people not invite others to church. Perhaps, I should have first defined an ‘inviting church.’

An inviting church is a congregation where the members seek opportunities to invite people to come to church. It does not have to be about proselytizing or converting someone from their current beliefs to ours. It is about sharing something meaningful in your life. We might say, “Being a part of UBC enriches my life, and I want others to experience the joy and fulfillment I experience.”

An inviting church has a steady stream of new people. We often have visitors. Some come because they are in Charlottesville for work or school, and they happen to be here on a Sunday. So, they join us for worship. These visitors bless us with their presence. We might see them again—if they happen to be here on a Sunday. Other visitors come because of our location. They are students or newcomers to the city, see our church, and decide to check it out.

An inviting church has a different kind of first-time visitor. The visitors are

guests. Someone has taken the time to invite them to join them in worship. Or, someone talked about the meaningful experience they have at UBC, and the guests decide to check it out and see if they find it meaningful too. These guests are different from the people who just happen to stop by. These guests enter the building and already know someone. They see their neighbors or friends or person who actually invited them. Someone knows their name. Someone can say, “Good morning! It’s so good to see you.”

Having an invited-person show up on a Sunday starts with an invitation. What excites you about UBC? What do you love? What do you want to share with someone else? There is so much happening in the life of the church. We have many choices about which exciting aspect of life at UBC to share. Let us join together and develop a culture of invitation.

I see it happening already. Whenever I hear about people in worship because someone else invited them, I want to shout, “Amen!” God is doing amazing things at UBC, and it is fantastic to be part of it!

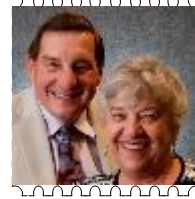
