Inviting as Helping

A key question in twenty-first-century marketing is, "Who can you help?" The days are long gone of marketing as advertising. What does this mean for the church?

For much of Church history, the institution functioned as part of the established order. From the time of Constantine, the established religion in the Western world was Christianity. In the twentyfirst century, there is no established religion. People have a choice. So, like the earliest followers of Christ, today people connect with those people. In this sense, decide whether or not to be part of a church.

If we were using outdated ideas, we would advertise. We would say things like, "Let's get the word out!" But, as Bob Dylan sang over half a century ago, "The times they are a-changin'." Today, the church has to mean something to people. If it means something, it tutional church. It reflects having some-

will survive. If it does not mean something, it will not survive. People will not simply come to church because everyone else does, or because a parent expects them go. Society puts no pressure on participating in God's work.

To invite someone to church means engaging in that marketing question, "Who can you help?" In other words, what does coming to church mean to you? Does it help you and enrich your life? If you can answer that question, then you can find other people who have a similar need. When you do, we can inviting is helping.

The Bible provides a pattern for inviting. The Greek word ευαγγελιζω (yooang-ghel-id-zo) is usually translated as "evangelize." The original meaning is closer to "announce good news" and "bring good tidings." The concept is far from proselytizing or building an insti-

thing worth sharing and telling people about it. The word occurs 52 times in the Bible.

When we invite people to join us at UBC, we invite them into community. We invite them to be part of something that provides meaning for our lives. The desire to give away something good drives our desire to share what is happening at UBC.

As we begin this Advent season, consider what you like best about UBC. Then, tell someone about it.
