## On Watch

Are we building toward something?

Advent started last Sunday. This is the season of looking ahead to Christmas. We kicked off Advent with a Hanging of the Green worship service. In an hour, the sanctuary is transformed. Before, it was our beautiful worship space. After, it was a magical collection of signs of the season. Each sanc-tuary decoration points to something in our tradition.

Does Advent build to something? What about the church? Is the church building to something? Children get excited at Christmastime. Usually pre excited at Christmastime. Usually pre-sents provide the excitement. What will Santa bring? The anticipation is part of the process. If presents random-ly showed up, they would lose some of their magic. In every generation, we can watch children develop an under-standing of how the cultural practice of Christmas and Christmas presents works. At some point in the autumn, their parents begin asking what they will ask Santa to bring. Some kids get into and pore over their lists. Others never catch the bug. pre

In church, the cycle of building and growing goes beyond Advent and Christmas. We seek to share God's grace with the world around us all year. Such good nave world year. Such good news would seem to be a breakthrough in this world of pain and struggle. Presenting a community where people can belong to one anoth-er should be more profound than a pre-sent on Christmas morning. Yet, if we do not prepare for it, jumping straight to inviting people into our community of God's grace is a bit like skipping Christmas preparation and going directly to gift-giving.

We build up. We plan. We set the stage. We get ready for the break-through. When the plan gets boring, we keep at it. We keep setting the stage. We keep refining our invitation. We keep reevaluating how we do what

we do and honing our ability to help we do and nothing our ability to help people connect in a variety of ways in our community. We repeat the mes-sage. We find creative new ways to share the message. It will get boring. It will seem like we have tried something before. We will go for periods without any discernable results.

We keep going. Just as a child cannot skip waiting for Christmas morning and Santa's visit, we cannot skip Ad-vent and go straight to Christmas. Likewise, we cannot skip the buildup and try to jump straight to the break-through. We can reach a breakthrough by an accumulation of steps, one after another, turn by turn. It should feel like an organic evolutionary process.

When we hope for church growth, one of the temptations can be to try new things. We start looking for a miracle things. We start looking for a miracle moment—some new program that will bring in lots of people. Jesus did not start with a program. He started by sharing God's love with the people around him. He reflected light into darkness. Moment by moment, he loved. He loved his disciples. He loved the Pharisee Nicodemus (John 3). He loved the unnamed woman at the well (John 4). He loved the sick people that he healed on the Sabbath (John 5). This season let us huild toward some-This season, let us build toward something. Let us build excitement as we move through Advent. But, on a deep-er level, let us keep building some-thing at UBC. Let us get ready for what God is doing in our community.
