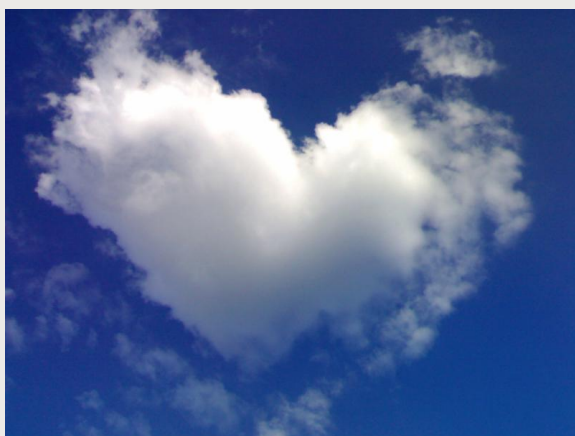
Family PACEM Prep Day January 20, 12:00 pm
