# BY THE NUMBERS UBC COMMUNITY AID

Over the next 11 weeks, students from UVA's Madison House will be using our building three nights a week preparing tax returns through the Cville Tax Aid program. Cville Tax Aid is a partnership led by the United Way – Thomas Jefferson area that provides free tax preparation services to households with incomes of \$55,000 per year or less. Last year the Coalition prepared more than 2600 returns with an economic impact of over 3.9 million dollars received in credits, refunds and saved preparation fees. Since 2007, over 19,000 returns have been prepared.

One of our main partners is the UVA Community Credit Union which prepare returns at six locations throughout Charlottesville and the surrounding counties. In addition, in Charlottesville we have 4 sites that operate completely with volunteers from the Madison House student led program. In September, Madison House holds interviews for preparers and starts an intensive training program from October through January, and operate sites from January 28th until April 15th. This year, there are over 240 IRS trained and certified preparers from this program.

I have been blown away by the level of commitment and dedication I've observed. They commit many many hours of time, training in the months preceding tax seasons, and a minimum of 4 hours per week as a preparer. Our site coordinators and two co-program directors commit to a lot more than that, starting to plan as soon as one tax season ends! It's more than I could ever imagine doing as a UVA student. I've also been blessed to see the connections they build with their clients during a stressful and confusing time. They are truly building community in this process.

As for the clients, the average income last year for our returns was \$25,000. These represent mostly working families that are our neighbors. The program ensures that the return they file is accurate, timely, and that all credits available by law are included in their return. Families use credits received on their returns to pay bills, buy groceries and otherwise catch up on expenses that a low income wage does not cover in a very high income place to live.

Last fall we learned that a site the program had used for years adjacent to the Medical Center was no longer going to be available. This site was near the hospital and convenient for hospital employees. This was a huge loss to this population that relies on this service. I ran the idea by the staff of the church and immediately got a response of "Yes, we can do this!".

Last week, Madison House Volunteers prepared 14 returns on 3 nights of operation. On Monday we had 14 additional appointments!

I am thrilled that when asked UBC stepped up to the plate to host this mission without hesitation. Without safe warm locations that welcome us, Cville Tax Aid would not be able to operate. With the help of UBC and a warm welcome, we anticipate being able to help even more members of our community in this critical mission.
