## Baby Steps & Long Range Planning

Over the past two years, there have been a number of small changes. Just this summer, for example, the ministers and choir stopped wearing robes (we will resume on the first Sunday in September), we moved the offertory earlier in the service, and we added a table for children to color during worship. What do all these changes mean?

We make decisions today for who we want to be in 5, 10, and 20 years in the future. Each tweak seems minor to some people and major to others. Sometimes, they might appear to be haphazard or disconnected. Other times, several little changes can appear to have something in common and be part of a larger plan.

Here's the larger plan: Share God's grace with our community and the world. Period. That is it. There is nothing complicated or grandiose. My goal is to share God's grace with every person I encounter.

How do we share God's grace with our community? We have to exist. Not only do we have to exist today, but we have to exist in the future. This is the reason we talk about stewardship and encourage people to financially support the church. This is also the reason we spend money on programs and expanding ministry. If we continuously cut our spending, we will cut back to nothing, and we will probably not exist in 20-30 years.

Instead of cutting, we want to grow. We want to spiritually grow, to grow in the depth of our knowledge of who God is and what God expects of us. We want to grow as a community, to grow closer to one another, to be more supportive of each other, and to minister to one another. We also want to grow in numbers.

How do wearing robes, offertory placement, and a children's coloring table help us grow? We do not know the impact yet. Some changes (like taking off the robes for the summer) are a trial. When Alba, Will, and I talk, we say, "Let's try it and see what happens." Other changes (like a children's coloring table) might lead to an even more family-friendly environment on Sunday mornings. We do not know the future. We do know who we serve, and we know that we cannot remain the same—if we do, we do not reflect the change in our hearts of knowing Christ.




### Live from Haiti...
