FLOWERS

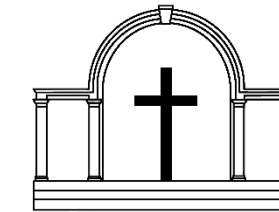

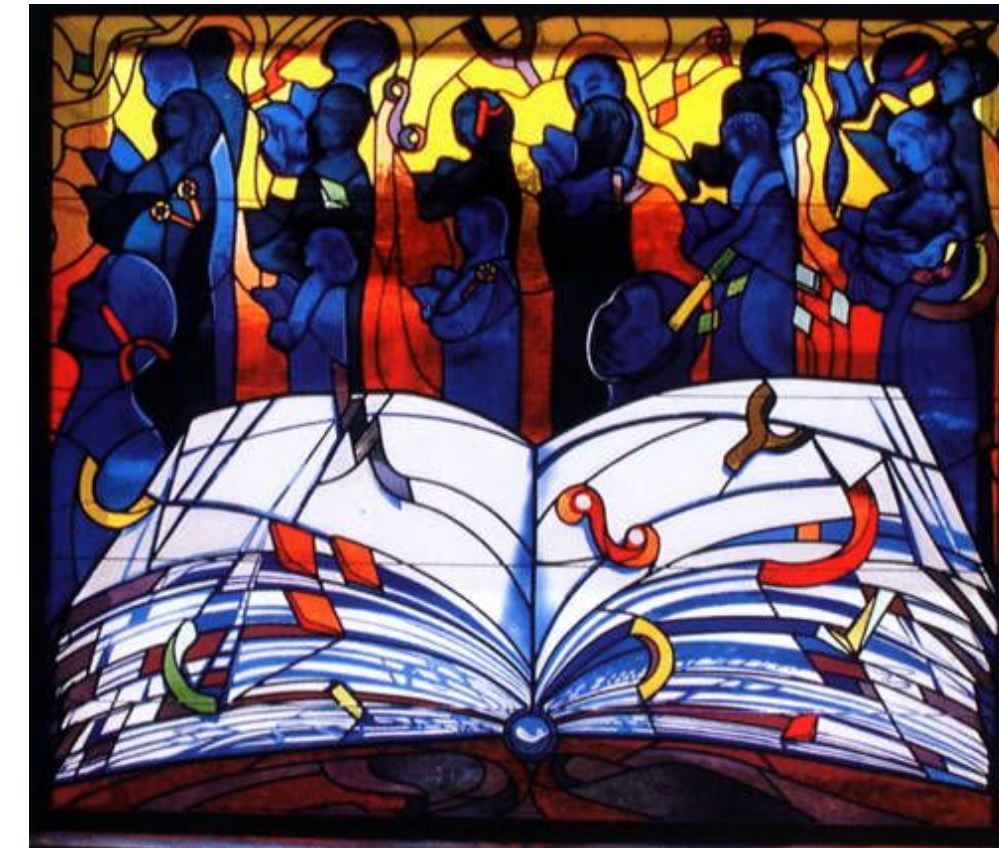
