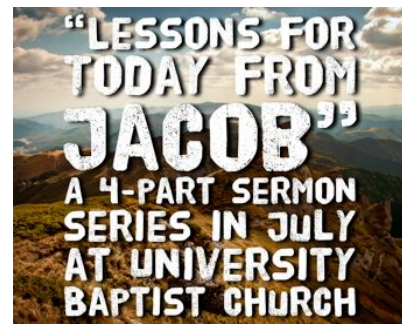

The flowers in the sanctuary today are given to the glory of God, and in memory of her parents Lloyd and Vera Bryant, by David and Linda Hendon.

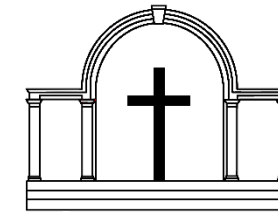
