Office Updates

At the beginning of the year, Will, Alba, and Matt went on a retreat. We worked on creating a culture for the ministers. Up to this point, the three of us had not invested a significant amount of time in our working relationship. Our time away was productive, and it will be helpful as we look at adding another minister to our staff.

We stayed in a house on the Chesapeake Bay and worked with Dr. M.J. Anderson-Leichty. She presented information to us and led us through some deep conversations. Our goal was to create a cultural covenant for the ministers at UBC. A new minister will need to agree to this cultural covenant before joining us.

Here is our cultural covenant:

1. We will respectfully tell each other what we think.
2. We will patiently embrace the wisdom that comes from giving one another 24 hours to process.
3. We will honor the talents God has given us by holding one another accountable to our clear expectations.
4. We will respect one another's sabbath and personal time as a way to rejuvenate.
5. We will openly share ideas, listen to understand, and close communication loops.
6. We will publicly support the decisions we make individually and collectively.
7. We will assume the best of one another and bring individual and congregational concerns directly to the minister involved.

Some of these cultural statements reflect how we already operate. There are a number of things we do well, and we want to celebrate each one. In making this list, we want to codify what we do well and be intentional about what we need to improve.



Kids and families have been busy the past few weeks, studying Bible stories, learning about God's love, and sharing God's love with the world.

At our interactive family service last week, instead of hearing one Bible story together, each family took a scripture passage, and presented it to the group. There were drawings, claymation retellings of parables, sign language, and even a version of the Good Samaritan featuring paper airplane pilots! It was amazing to see the kids grapple with their stories, try to understand them as best they could, and then observe the amazing creativity with which they shared their stories with the group!

Last Saturday night, kids and families gathered to put their faith

into action, preparing a taco dinner for our PACEM guests. We had 20 kids and their parents join us, including 3 families who have not been to a UBC event before. Kids helped brown taco meat, rolled napkins with silverware, manned the drink table, decorated 60 cupcakes, and assembled 48 to-go breakfast bags including hand-written

notes that said "You are loved!" or "Have a great day!" or other encouraging words. And though some of them needed a

step stool to see over the serving table, they all lined up to serve tacos, and enjoyed eating, chatting, and working puzzles with the guests afterward. Everyone at UBC has worked so hard the past few weeks to make PACEM happen, and our kids have been thrilled to be a part of this community effort to show love and hospitality to our neighbors.
