Being Present During a Time of NWATCH

As I looked from face to face during the recent church wide Zoom party, I thought about being present. I don't mean simply showing up. By being present, I mean being engaged, actively listening to what someone says, and continuing to think about the person later.

Being present is an awareness of the moment. It means taking in one's surroundings. Being present with another person frees us from previous interactions. The past is the past. Being present is about this moment, right now. The moment can be pregnant with opportunities and possibly even include some latent excitement. There's gratitude in the moment because experiencing it is a blessing, and when we are blessed, we say thank you.

COVID-19 presents a special challenge to being fully present. Zoom is fraught with distractions. During the call, we divided into virtual rooms so that we could have more intimate conversations. Yet, I maintained an eye on the larger controls for the call. Just as I listened to someone tell about her week, I saw a new arrival in the Zoom waiting room.

During a pandemic, we cannot be together in the same physical space, and video conferences make being fully present a challenge. Still, God calls us to care for one another, to listen to each other's stories, and be present. The challenges are worth addressing.

Despite Zoom-fatigue, social distancing, and varying opinions about when and how we can gather, join video calls and listen to one another. Doing so allows us to be the family God called us to be. Pray for wisdom for church leaders. We are working together to provide clarity about when and how we can be in the same space again.

Prayer Concerns


Pray for our world, as we all face the reality of the COVID-19 pandemic.




UBC Fellowship Conversation
