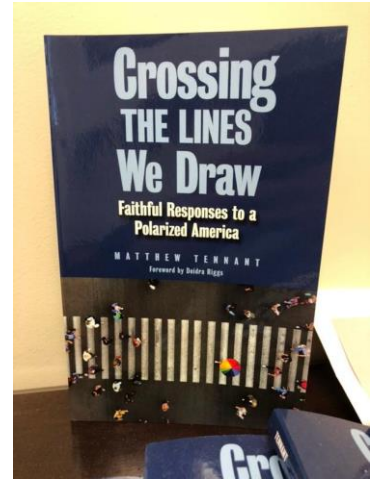
What is "Lectio Divina"?

On our calendar and in the Word for the past few months, you may have seen a listing for "lectio divina." What is that? Well, I'm glad you asked! Lectio divina, or "sacred reading," is an ancient way of reading Scripture. Rather than analyzing a passage and considering its context as we would in a traditional Bible Study, lectio divina invites us simply to listen to the passage and hear what God may be saying to us through it today. This is not a substitute for our typical study, but a complement to it. There's no prepwork ahead of time, and you don't need to bring anything with you. Simply come with an open mind and a desire to read the Bible together. It's a quick 20-minute session on Zoom. Hope to see you there! - Will

A Last-Minute Christmas Gift Suggestion

If you are still looking for a Christmas gift for someone (or yourself), I recommend our pastor's book, [Crossing the Lines We Draw: Faithful Responses to a Polarized America](#), published this year. Matt wrote this in response to the August 12, 2017 Unite the Right rally in Charlottesville.

He describes the book as a scriptural response to the "epidemic of division" in our land. He uses scriptures from the Old Testament prophets, the gospels, Paul's letters, and Revelation to address the polarization and politicization of our era. He begins with Mary, the mother of Jesus, appropriate for the Advent season. "When God is speaking, my views (or yours) do not matter. God's voice is the one that matters," he writes.



Matt deals directly with specific issues of conflict in America and elsewhere. His ultimate goal is to discern constructive ways the church and individuals can respond to the warring tribalism around us. He shares some of his own attempts to overcome division and approaches others have used.

The book is well-written and very readable (in paperback and only 152 pages). Like Jesus, Matt often answers a question with a question calling us to self-reflection and questioning of our own presumptions and responses.

Here are some quotes from the book:

"Are we fed by the algorithms of our social media feeds, where every message complements our history of 'likes' and 'dislikes'?"

"I am concerned that speaking the truth even in love can end the opportunity for future conversations."

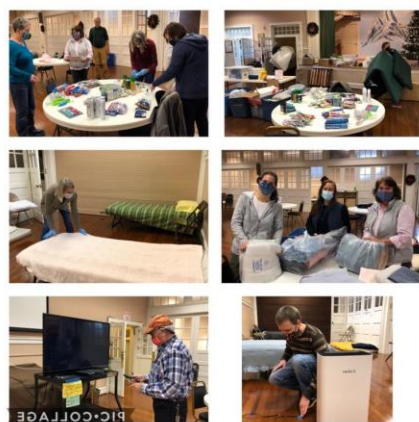
"Peter and Paul...either reconciled their differences, or acknowledged them and continued their work."

"Stubbornly taking a stand and refusing to try and see the world from another person's perspective misses God's presence and activity in the world."

"Never try reconciliation via written word."
