## A Melting Snowman

When I first saw the rather grisly snowman in my yard, I immediately snapped a photo. A melting snowman is almost comically macabre, with limbs and body parts gradually dropping to the ground. Standing beside this pitiful snowman, which had been so cheerful the day before, the thought that came to mind was: I know how you feel.

Perhaps you can relate. A year since when we first learned the term “coronavirus,” perhaps you are feeling worn down as well. The isolation of this year and the accumulated losses, large and small, have taken their toll on all of us. Yet we stand now at the beginning of the season of Lent, a subdued period when we typically slow down, reflect on our mortality and sinfulness, and embark with Christ into the wilderness of suffering and pain. To me, it feels like we’ve been there all year.

So how do we enter Lent this year? Many of us often give up something for Lent, making an intentional choice to eliminate something that distracts us, or to set aside something pleasurable in order to draw our attention back to something deeper. This can

As we prepare for Ash Wednesday and the arrival of Lent, I hope you will pray about how God is leading you. One place to find ideas is the list of practices we will be referencing in our Sunday Bible Study during Lent, as described below. 

## **New Bible Study series begins this Sunday!**

As we enter into the season of Lent, our Sunday morning Bible study will turn to examine our own experiences of this season. Lent is traditionally a time when we give something up for the 40 days (not counting Sundays) leading up to Easter. The past year has been an extended practice in giving up - giving up hugs, handshakes, smiling at the person you pass in the produce section, eating in your favorite restaurants, lingering over coffee with a good friend. So perhaps now is a time when we need to add in a new practice.

Over the season of Lent, our Sunday Bible study will be following **Forty Simple Practices for Lent** by Sarah Bessey. You can find a printable version of these practices [here](#). Each Sunday we will spend some time discussing our experiences trying these practices - which were easy? Which were hard? What might you try to continue after Lent is over? We will end each week with a reading of Psalm 90 from a variety of translations, reading this one Psalm several weeks in a row as a practice of careful contemplation. Because so much of this study will be discussion based, we encourage those who usually watch on YouTube to consider joining us on Zoom!



## Lenten Worship Theme

During the season of Lent, our worship services each week will focus on one of the psalms. Exploring the themes of these ancient texts, we discover that the joys, struggles, and promise of these texts continue to reverberate in our context today. Whether your presence is physically in the sanctuary or through the use of technology (most of us these days), we hope you will join us in worship as we sing our way through Lent in the Psalms.

## Ash Wednesday Service

Feb. 17, 7:00pm

We read in Matthew 6 that Jesus says, "And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

Our Ash Wednesday service this year will take place in the privacy of our own homes. The ashes imposed on our foreheads will not bring recognition from others we pass on the sidewalk; they will be between each one of us and God. These "ashes in secret" are a powerful reminder of our own mortality and the deeper promise of the life God gives us, even so.

We hope you will join us for this service, which will be available to livestream on our church YouTube page. Because of the pandemic, we will not be able to administer the ashes in person. Instead, we will provide ashes that you can apply to your own hand or forehead during the service. You can also use oil or ashes of your own. ## Creating a UniBap College Ministry Space

One of the action points in our congregational goals for 2021 is to make space to invite our neighbors into our building and fellowship. Providing study space to college students through the fall semester shed light on one particular way to welcome those students now and in the years to come: we are creating a dedicated college student space in the church! Our youth already have dedicated space where they feel a sense of ownership and belonging in the building, and we hope to create a space where college students can feel equally welcome and wanted. After talking to several students about where in the building we might create this space, we have selected Room G-17 (formerly the Nia Room or Joyful Servants classroom).

Work has already begun to update the space, with a fresh coat of paint going on the walls soon. There are several ways you can participate in our renovation! First and foremost, pray for the students who will inhabit the space, this semester and beyond, and for the relationships that will be built there.
