### “Joining the Conversation”

I often wonder how we can get more members of the church

family to join conversations in church life. Recently, I realized that I might be asking the wrong question. Instead, I should ask, “What conversation would be so compelling that people would want to join it?”

Rich conversations can take place during Bible studies or small group meetings. They can be informal in the hall or UniBap Park. We can organize town hall style meetings, community conversations, or zoom meetings. Rich conversations inspire us to imagine new worlds and creative solutions. We can look at the future and think about what could be. We learn and grow, and our worldview expands in ways we would have never imagined before. When we go deep, our faith connects with current events and informs our response.

Too often, life in churches is limiting. The institution needs feeding like a hungry machine. HVAC technicians service each unit, and an IT consultant fixes an IP address issue. Countless other mundane tasks fill the days of staff and volunteers. If we are not careful, these tasks can push aside the reason we come to church. As the ordinary and necessary operational tasks occupy more time, transformation in Christ gets less of our attention.

Cajoling people to participate doesn't work. Or, it doesn't work for very long. The role of churches in society is evolving. As the cultural peer pressure to find a church diminished, every church faced the happy task of being relevant to people in their daily lives. No one was going to push anyone to go to church. Each person gets to choose whether or not to be part of a family of faith. When churches have to matter to people, they must each find what resonates with people. That's why being relevant is a happy task.

### What has the Kittie Colvin Trail Circle been up to during the COVID 19 pandemic?

The Kittie Colvin Trail Circle is a small group of women of varying ages, occupations, and family status. Our purpose is to serve Christ through mission activities, and to nurture and support each other. We welcome you to visit with us and learn more about us.



On March 3, 2020 the Kittie Colvin Trail Circle met on our usual first Tuesday of the month, with hardly a care in the world. Little did we know that in the following week the world would come to a complete stop and be thrown into turmoil and isolation by the COVID 19 virus. For the next few months we found ourselves in a holding pattern, not meeting, not planning, just waiting to see when this crisis would be over. The world was saying things like, “surely we’ll be back together by Easter.” As you know it is taking much longer.

By June we were all a little squirrely, and Debby Johnson invited us to gather—socially distanced and masked—in her front yard. It was a wonderful time of catching-up and commiserating. By fall we thought things were getting better. We met in October and November in the fellowship hall, masked and six feet apart. Catching up on our mission projects and planning for the Christmas season. COVID got worse instead of better, so In December we began meeting by ZOOM, and did so through the winter. On a warm spring evening on April 6, we again met in person, masked and six feet apart in Sarah Buchanan’s front yard. It was so good to feel almost normal.

In addition to all of the church-wide missions efforts, the Kittie Circle has sponsored a Nada, Kentucky kindergarten class for many years. Our kindergarten teacher is Dianna Gilbert. Nada is one of the poorest communities in the United States. Like Charlottesville area children, they began school on-line in September and returned to in-school classes about the first of March. In August and January we sent gift cards for classroom supplies. We also sent Christmas gifts for the children, Valentines, and a small gift card for their upcoming end of year celebration.

During this time of pandemic, we have continued checking with the UVA Hospital Hospitality House and delivering quarterly cleaning products and paper goods. They are operating on a very restricted occupancy so haven’t needed as many supplies from us.

The Kittie Circle normally sponsors the UBC Christmas Post Office, where church folks can exchange greeting cards then donate what they would have spent on postage to the Global Missions Offering. With our worship meeting virtually and not being in church in person, we had to cancel the Post Office this past December.

Each year we get a Christmas family from Albemarle County schools. We usually get together for lunch and shop for clothing for these children. This past December we received the names of two brothers, 3rd and 5th graders. Instead of our usual group shopping trip, one of our ladies did all the shopping and delivered our gifts to the school.

As most of you are aware our church usually works with PACEM (People and Congregations Engaged in Ministry) to house local homeless men for two weeks during February. This past year due to COVID, UBC was asked to house the men for the entire month of December. The Kittie Circle provided dinner for all the men and PACEM staff one night. We also collected wash cloths and towels, and items for Christmas stockings for the guests.

We minister to a number of church friends as they become home bound. Even though we were unable to visit our friends in person we continued to deliver birthday, anniversary, and holiday cards, and Christmas gifts.

Most recently, at our April front-yard meeting, we collected cleaning and housekeeping supplies for AIM (the Alliance of Interfaith Ministries) to share with their Secure Seniors and Reach Program clients. On May 4, depending on the weather, we will again meet in Debby Johnson’s
