## “Insider/Outsider Language”

## ON WATCH

Occasionally, I encounter reminders of the distinction between insiders and outsiders in the church. Before addressing these reminders, we remember that the pillars of our faith community know this church inside and out. They are the consummate insiders and know the secret passages and the appropriate circuit breakers for different outlets. They know how many manuals and documentation books we have (hint: lots!). They help us function and live out God’s calling. We are thankful for them because, if we didn’t have them, we would all be lost.

Today, I am thinking about how we draw new people (outsiders) into our family. When someone joins the church, our current onboarding process is informal. People hear about something and might ask about it. Or, someone realizes they don’t know and offers a further explanation. All of us could do a better job passing along institutional knowledge. Sharing what we know draws people in and helps them feel like they are a part of UBC life.

Recently, in our staff meeting, someone referenced “the old sandwich board.” We have a newer sandwich board and put it outside to advertise things like AQPTS (Aside: do you know what that acronym means? How about JARC or OIAM?). During the meeting, we realized that we planned to advertise two events at once and someone said, “We could always use the old sandwich board.” The old one is not in plain sight. The person who was trying to figure out how to put two signs on the new board had no idea that a second board existed and was available.

The sandwich board example is minor. It was easily resolved by telling everyone about it. What about documents? Our church has a Constitution, Bylaws, Leadership Manual, Deacon Manual, and Administrative Manual. These documents are

helpful and serve a variety of purposes. For example, the Administrative Manual helps us avoid losing institutional knowledge when someone retires. Before it existed, almost all administrative information was in our long-tenured administrative assistant's head. After she retired, we began writing things down so we wouldn't have the same informational gap again.

The downside to formalized documents and extensive institutional knowledge is the insider/outsider disparity. Insiders know what is happening. Outsiders might happen upon the information. We can do better about drawing people in and including them as full members of our church family. Our documentation can help orient new folks to the UniBap culture—as long as we remember to share them.

To this end, the Nominating Committee is starting to work on filling the 2021-22 opportunities to serve. Volunteer to serve on a committee or team where you haven't served before. Your fresh eyes will help all of us learn how we can improve our information transfer. Try to look at our church as if you were a visitor and discover what obstacles keep you from feeling at home. Then, let's remove those obstacles.
