UBC 2030: What is the future of the church?

A few months ago, we conducted a number of community conversations. In each one, I asked participants various questions about the future. Our primary focus was the post-pandemic church. We seemed to all agree that we miss the sense of community which came from being together in person.

Now, as we regather in worship and look forward to restarting Wednesday night programming, we must begin looking beyond the immediate post-pandemic future and think about the future of the church. The decisions we make now are not for us. The decisions we make are for the church in 5, 10, or 20 years. Imagining the church of 2041 is challenging because we don't know what the world will be like in 20 years. Will we have flying cars? If so, where will we park during worship? Maybe we should focus on where God is calling us in 2030.

In 2019, we felt like God was leading us to grow. We were so convinced that God has big things in store for us that we voted to call a fourth minister. When we had our community conversations earlier this year, every person felt the Holy Spirit leading us to grow. We even said that we are willing to endure some discomfort and expect some changes to grow.

Over the next few months, I will be exploring ideas about the future of the church in this weekly column. You will find questions, information about conversations the ministers and lay leaders are having, and a challenge to be engaged in this journey. The focus of UBC 2030 is not inward; it is all about looking outward and listening to what the Holy Spirit is saying.

My priority is Jesus calling us to build the kingdom of God. We as a church can be *more* life-giving, spirit-focused, and engaged

in doing God's work. To thrive, we must be relevant. When people check us out, I want them to see Jesus in our midst and feel like they want to get involved. Future changes might include how we are organized, conduct our business, or count members. There's no set agenda for the future, which is why we must all pray and listen together. Some changes can start small and start now. Others will take more time. In either case, God calls us to get moving.

According to a Pew Research study, people are leaving churches in droves. But those people still have spiritual needs. People are not making a theological decision that favors atheism over God. People are leaving the institutional church. They are leaving the church structure. We need to evaluate how we do what we do and ensure that our church reflects Jesus above everything else. The thousands of people who walk by our building every day have spiritual needs. How is God calling us to meet those needs?

For now, I challenge you to pray for God's guidance in the future, and I am asking you to ask God what you are called to do. Every person in our congregation has a part to play. What is yours?

WMU Woodbrook School Supplies Project

To begin school this coming school year 2021-2022, according to the Woodbrook Elementary School website, the suggested supply list for first graders will cost \$38.13 (and those are the Walmart back-to-school sale off-brand prices). Sixty-seven percent of the Woodbrook families are on public assistance and cannot afford to buy their children what they need. The financial hardships added by the COVID 19 pandemic have compounded the needs of these children.



In 2008, Love INC paired the WMU with the Family Support

Workers at Woodbrook Elementary. In the beginning, we asked you to bring in a variety of school supplies that we sorted and delivered to the school. This method was pretty chaotic. For the last 13 years, we have asked you to donate money. We then asked the Family Support Workers what things they specifically needed, purchased those supplies, and delivered them to the school. The Woodbrook Family Support Workers were delighted with this more efficient method.
