UBC 2030: Where are we starting?

Before the pandemic, we averaged around 170 people attending worship each week. However, this summer, we have had about 50-80 people in person each week. Our Facebook and YouTube live streams appear in the feeds of a few hundred people each week, averaging a few dozen individuals watching a significant portion of our services each week.

The pandemic taught all of us the value of remaining connected while we are apart. In the future, we will continue to share our worship service live on the internet and try to be as inclusive as possible with the viewers. Yet, we have not been able to truly engage viewers in the same way we can with people who come to the sanctuary.

The way people attend church is changing. Years ago, active church membership meant attending a worship service between 3-4 times per month. Now, according to [David Odom](#) at Duke University, many active participants attend once a month. To achieve the same in person attendance as twenty years ago requires three times as many congregants, and we have to figure out how to better engage our virtual congregants.

As we look to the future and imagine church in 2030, we start from an uncertain position. There are fewer people who are worshipping in person than before the pandemic. Some of the trends, especially disengagement with organized religion, have accelerated during the pandemic. When we look to the future, we do not start from some point in the past. We start where we are right now.

As a family of faith, we face some financial headwinds and the normal challenges of an aging congregation. We aspire to have more students and young people, and we wish for greater diversity. But that's not who we are yet.

Right now, we are seeking to follow God into the future. Gathering together in person allows us to get to know one another better. We can read nonverbal cues and have informal conversations before and after worship. To reach our community more effectively, we need to
