



### Be More Welcoming (at the Aug 18 Church Conference??)

## ON WATCH

In our community conversations earlier this spring, when I spoke with many of you via Zoom, we heard people say how they wanted us to be a more welcoming church. (Click [here](#) for a summary of those conversations.) People said they want to incorporate visitors in the life of the church, even if it means prioritizing being welcoming over something else. In our [2021 Vision and Goals](#), we talked about making space to invite our neighbors into our building and church life. We can take positive steps for the future and be more welcoming right now.

On Wednesday, August 18, we will have a church conference. I want us to try something radical on August 18. First, let's begin by singing a hymn. If you have thoughts about what hymn we should sing, please let Will Cooke know. Otherwise, he will pick one for us to sing as we start our time together. Second, after we sing a hymn, let's celebrate the Lord's supper. Taking communion will center our focus on the reason we are doing business.

We will still confirm deacons' emeriti and the 2021-22 nominations for church leadership. We will also hear a report from the ministry transition team and hear an update from Larry Martin about the church's financial status. Here's a preview: it's remarkably similar to our status in 2019 when

we felt God leading us to become a four-minister church. Then, we will vote on an associate minister search committee.

By singing a hymn and celebrating Holy Communion before we begin our business, we welcome the Holy Spirit and emphasize our new life in Christ. Colossians 3.1-17 describes this new life in Christ. It says to “clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience” (3.12) and “with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God” (3.16).

As we prepare to conduct the business of the church, we can focus on the risen Christ and imagine his desire for the church. We tend to frame our questions in secular instead of spiritual terms. For example, when we propose electing someone as a deacon emeritus, we do not do so to show partiality. The Bible is clear that we should not show partiality (e.g., Acts 10.34; Romans 2.11; James 2.9; etc.). We nominate deacons’ emeriti as a celebration of committed work in the name of Christ. This celebration is an invitation to everyone to join a life in Christ. It’s supposed to be life-giving and joy-filled.

Welcoming the Holy Spirit and finding focus on Christ is a preliminary step to becoming more welcoming of those around us. When we master carrying out our business as a people “clothed in compassion,” drawing in others becomes natural.

## Deacon Emeritus

The designation of Deacon Emeritus recognizes Deacons whose service and contributions have been exemplary. The Active Deacons have nominated five candidates to be presented for congregational approval at the next Church Conference (Aug. 18). Each week, we will highlight one or two of these candidates in The Word.

### Lynn Martin

Lynn and Larry joined UBC in 1972. Lynn launched her Deacon service in 1988 and served 7 terms with Ministers Keith Smith and Tom Leland. Most noteworthy, Lynn served as UBC's first female Deacon chairperson from 1991-1993. She helped lead the congregation through the *Together We Build* and *Rebuilding God's House* capital fundraising campaigns, plus two major renovation projects. Also during her service, Deacons strengthened the Family Ministry Plan as it evolved into the current Circle of Caring model. Lynn's favorite memories as a Deacon include "being at the heart of the spiritual leadership of and ministry to the UBC congregation."

## Provide Dinner on Sunday Evenings for Youth and Jubilate

As we approach the fall semester, plans are coming together for a return of weekly meetings of our youth group and Jubilate on Sunday evenings. UBC provides dinner for these students each Sunday at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall.
