“Start with why.” Simon Sinek’s aphorism suggests that people need to know the reason for something before they can get excited about it. When we began planning the Touch-A-Truck event, we didn’t really explain the reasons for planning an event like this. We told you what it is, and many of you remember it from a few years ago.
