Finding Grace During Lent

So far, this Lenten season, our emphasis in worship, emails, and gatherings has been about getting ready for Easter. What about grace?

God's grace is central to our faith. We are all sinners in need of forgiveness (Romans 3:23). Nothing we can do on our own brings us to God. Yet, while we were still separated from God, Jesus made it possible for us to be justified (Romans 5:8). This free gift is the grace that is available to us (Romans 6:23).

Too often, we overlook grace. The English word comes from the Greek *charisma* and Latin *gratia*. It means "God's unmerited favor, love, or help." This is the word used in Romans 1:11, 5:15, 5:16, 6:23, 11:29, and 12:6. It's also in 1 Corinthians 1:7, 7:7, 12:4, 12:9, 12:28, 12:30, 12:31, and we find it in 2 Corinthians 1:11, 1 Timothy 4:14, 2 Timothy 1:6, and 1 Peter 4:10.

In our daily lives, the challenge becomes not only accepting God's grace but seeing it in the world around us. After feeding the four thousand, Jesus heard the disciples lamenting having only one loaf of bread for lunch. They were out in a boat, and he cautioned them about missing the point of his miracles. Then, he said, "Do you have eyes, and fail to see? Do you have ears, and fail to hear?" (Mark 8:18).

What about us? Do we see the evidence of grace around us? Grace is the free gift of love and acceptance God offers, and it can appear in many ways. Living out our faith and seeking to embody grace can help us be available for God's use. Trying to seek God's presence can open our eyes and help us see. Listening for God's voice in the world around us can
