# Who Will Guide Me?

# **WATCH**

Last week, we looked at Stephen, "full of grace and power" (Acts 6:8). The Holy Spirit led him to perform great wonders and the religious leaders brought charges against him. Acts 7 is Stephen's brilliant reply, which tells the story of the ancient Israelites starting with Abraham, going through the patriarchs, the exodus from Egypt, and Moses. He ends by calling his accusers, "stiff-necked heathens" (Acts 7:51). Their anger turns to fury, and they kill him. Stephen was the first martyr, and people started persecuting the Christ-followers (Acts 8:1).

Sometime later, the Lord led Philip to head south (Acts 8:26). So, Philip went. As he traveled along the road, he saw an Ethiopian court official traveling in his chariot and reading from the scroll of Isaiah. The Holy Spirit told him to join the Ethiopian in his chariot. Philip did, and after sitting down next to the Ethiopian, he asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"

The Ethiopian's response echoes conversations people have all the time, "How can I understand it unless someone guides me?"

We might not use the exact same phrases today, but we have similar interactions with people. They might say, "Why did this happen?" Or, "What's the meaning of all this?" Helping someone find meaning or understand why something is happening does not mean we have all the answers. It means we are fellow sojourners and willing to get into the chariot with them. Philip wasn't omniscient. He practiced the sacred attunement of hearing the Spirit and acting on what it said.

I can imagine Philip hesitating. It's easy to picture him responding, "You want me to what?" Sometimes we rationalize with God. Philip could have said, "I don't know what to say." Instead, according to Acts 8:26-40, he responded when the Lord spoke.

Philip explained Isaiah's prophecy and told his new friend about Jesus. The Ethiopian saw some water and asked, "What is to prevent you from baptizing me now?"

To me, that's the way the Spirit works. We listen to what God says and then do it. The Lord initiates divine encounters. When we are attuned to the sacred movements, we get to be part of it.

Last week we learned from Stephen: (1) Know what you believe and why you believe it. (2) Don't be afraid to talk about it. (3) Stand firm in your faith. This week, Philip reminds us to be open to the movement of the Spirit and to act when God calls us.

Each year we collect a special offering to support missions in the state of Virginia. This August, our missions emphasis will support the chaplain ministry at the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women. Our goal is \$3,000. Here is some information from Chaplain Jerusha Moses, whose ministry our offering will support:

Dear friends, Due to "separation of church and state," GraceInside is a nonprofit Christian ministry that places chaplains inside Virginia's prisons so that lives may be transformed through the grace of Jesus Christ. As a GraceInside chaplain, I am dedicated to meeting the spiritual needs of all residents of Vir-

ginia's state prisons. I currently serve in Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women, providing one-onone pastoral care, conducting worship services, and working with the Department of Corrections staff in offering rehabilitative programs. I am also responsible for scheduling all religious programs conducted by volunteers representing many faith traditions.

As the temperature gets cooler and the leaves change color, I am reminded that God's mercies are new every morning; God continues to work patiently in our lives, transforming us, and sanctifying us to the likeness of the image of God's Son, Jesus. What an honor it is to partner with the Savior bringing faith, hope, and love to incarcerated men and women, as Christ says in Matthew 25, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me."

Bio: Chaplain Moses is an ordained Baptist minister. She completed her master's degree in divinity and a doctorate degree in ministry at the Baptist Theological Seminary in Richmond. She majored in biblical studies and obtained a master's degree in theology at the Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. She taught World Religions as adjunct faculty at Virginia Commonwealth University. Her doctoral project was in the field of grief and loss. She lives in Richmond with her sixteenyear-old daughter, a stage 4 cancer survivor. Her grandparents were a major influence on her life. They retired from the Department of Corrections in India and told her bedtime stories of their work in Corrections. The stories took deep root in her impressionable heart and are the reason for her passion for prison ministry today.

### WMU Woodbrook School Supplies Project

To begin school this coming school year 2023-2024, according to the Woodbrook Elementary School website, the suggested supply list for first graders will cost \$44.29 - a 16% increase over the price from two years ago. Sixty percent of the Woodbrook families are on public assistance and cannot afford to buy their children what they need. The financial hardships added by the pandemic and sky-rocketing inflation have compounded the needs of these children. In 2008, Love INC paired the UBC WMU with the Family Support workers at Woodbrook Elementary. In the beginning, we asked you to bring in a variety of school supplies that we sorted and delivered to the school. This method was pretty chaotic. For the last 15 years, we have asked you to donate money. We then asked the Family Support workers what things they specifically needed, purchased those supplies and delivered them to the school. The Woodbrook Family Support workers were delighted with this more efficient method. We want to continue to meet the needs of the less fortunate children " . . . to give (them) hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).
