Caring for Creation Means Acting

In September, we will revisit a familiar theme from the last few years, ecotheology. At its most basic level, ecotheology is a constructive theology focusing on the relationship between nature and our faith. Constructive theology is a conversation that is always in process and open to interaction with other forms of knowledge, including knowledge produced in the social and natural sciences.

In recent weeks, I wrote about Stephen (Acts 7) and Philip (Acts 8). Stephen shows us to: (1) Know what you believe and why you believe it. (2) Don't be afraid to talk about it. (3) Stand firm in your faith. Philip demonstrates responding to God's Spirit and going where we are called. Both are examples of transformation in Christ being manifested in how we live. Following their examples deepens our relationship with God, but it requires some work on our part. We have to take the lessons and apply them to life in the twenty-first century.

Here is one we can apply these lessons to today: (1) I believe God created and cares for the earth, and scripture and the Christian tradition is filled with support for this belief. (2) I am not afraid to talk about it. We focus on ecotheology each September and, when a Bible passage nudges me in that direction, other times too. Also, we have started exploring the idea of adding solar panels to the roof of the church. (3) While I stand firm in this belief, I am open to grow and learn from each conversation we
