You Are Welcome Here (Part 4)

What's your favorite part of being in the UBC family? Friends, music, worship, seeing the children, the sanctuary, the church's history, traditions, chance to sing hymns, your circle, choir, Jubilate, opportunities to do good, Rise Against Hunger, learning, spiritual growth, working with the work crew, the food ... I'm sure there are more things people might name as their favorite part of being in the UBC family (or, maybe not). Either way, when we list our favorite things, they are the life-giving activities of UBC life.

Few people would shout, "Serving on committees," when asked about their favorite thing at UBC. My evidence comes from the challenge to find people who are willing to serve. Please don't misunderstand me. There are some saints who thrive on committees, and we thank God for them every day. Giving them opportunities to serve where they feel called is part of being welcoming.

This gets to the crux of this series of articles. Welcoming people means meeting them where they are and becoming the kind of church where we can plug people in where they feel called to serve. If we have more people who want to sing in a choir than the average church, then we will have a disproportionately large choir based on the size of our congregation. And we do. Having people who like to work means that we can prepare 106,056 meals for the hungriest people on the planet. And we did.

The question each of us needs to answer is: What is our favorite part of being in the UBC family? When we answer

that question, we need to find ways to feed that ministry. When we see areas in church life that energize a lot of people, we should be fanning the flames of the Holy Spirit. In John 3, when Jesus answered Nicodemus' question about being born again, he said, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So, it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit" (John 3:8).

When the Holy Spirit is moving, we follow. Sometimes we can see the movement of the Spirit by watching what energizes God's people. Last week, I wrote about how becoming a welcoming family might involve some changes to the way we are organized. Regarding changes, I quoted Edwards Deming, "Two basic rules of life are: 1) Change is inevitable. 2) Everybody resists change."

Deming was a business theorist and was describing corporations. However, he could have been writing about churches. Next year, the Joint Administrative Review Committee (JARC) will evaluate our structure and suggest any necessary changes. As we seek to be God's people, follow the Spirit, and focus on life-giving ministries, what structural changes do we need to make?
