You Are Welcome Here (Part 6)

I began this series in early October, and it represents a bigger journey for the church *writ* large. My perspective has focused on our church, but most churches are trying to figure out how to be God's family of faith in 2023 and beyond. Throughout the U.S., churches are going through changes. Some are good and some are bad, and all will require some adjustment. These changes have been developing for many decades. In fact, since the time of Christ, what it means to be a Christ-follower and how Christ-followers relate to one another have been evolving. "Change is a constant" (Heraclitus), and we are no exception. The church has always been changing.

The pandemic accelerated many of the changes that were already in progress. Cultural affiliation with institutions dropped like a rock in 2020, and many people who had been involved in churches found other things to occupy their time and energy. This translated into lower participation rates than before.

Yet, in this climate, our church is flourishing in many ways.

We worship together each week. The services are rich, varied, and include many, many participants. We have new people joining our church. It's not a flood, but people are joining. Our Sunday morning Bible study groups are alive

and vibrant. And, we put our faith into action (caring for one another, visiting the sick, lifting each other up in prayer, housing the unhoused through PACEM, and feeding the hungry). There are many reasons to maintain hope in Christ. We can trust that God is doing something special at University Baptist Church.

Last week, I wrote about exploring some structural changes in the way we organize ourselves as a church. 2024 is an appropriate time to explore these types of changes, because we will have our Joint Administrative Review Committee (JARC). By shifting to a more streamlined organizational structure, my prayer would be to empower more people to give their time, energy, and resources to the things that give them the most joy. Twelve Deacons could provide spiritual leadership, twelve members of Church Council could handle the administrative work of the committees, and a five-member Nominating Committee could name four new members of Church Council each year (on a three-year rotation). This reduces the demand on the congregation to fill slots on committees.

However, restructuring our lay-led organization is only one part of welcoming people into our church family. Responding to this evolving post-organized-religion world will involve changes on multiple levels. Don't worry. I don't think it involves a certain style of music or following trends set by megachurches. The changes might be in the way we do life together. I believe it will involve more spiritual growth and greater focus on Christ. What will this look like?






Annual Friendsgiving Dinner Thursday, November 16
